**1. INTRODUCTION:**

**1.1 STATE CET ACT:**

- 1.1.1 The Government of Maharashtra has passed “The Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Education Institutions (Regulation of Admission & Fees) Act 2015”. As per the act, the State Government has published the rules in Maharashtra Government Gazette No. CET 1215/C.R.412/15/Edu-2, dated: 19/01/2017, and Amendments published by Government of Maharashtra from time to time. **(Annexure – Q).**
- 1.1.2 As per Government Resolution No. CET 3516/C.R.478/16/Edu-2 dated 20/02/2018, the admissions to all Medical Postgraduate Degree/ Diploma Courses i.e. MD/MS/PG Diploma, (excluding admissions done by Central Government/ Directorate General of Health Services, New Delhi) should be as per merit of NEET-PG through Combined Counseling/ Centralized admission process. This is inclusive of Institutional Quota/ NRI Quota **(Annexure – R).**
- 1.1.3 As per Government Resolution No. CET 3518/C.R.32/18/Edu-2, dated: 29/01/2018, admissions for various Postgraduate courses at all Government/Corporation /Government aided Medical Colleges situated in the State of Maharashtra for State Quota Seats is being carried out in accordance with the procedure laid down through this Government Resolution and on the basis of directions/decisions given by Hon’ble Court in various court orders **(Annexure – V).**
- 1.1.4 Government of Maharashtra has given approval for NEET-PG-2022 Information Brochure as per Letter No. MED-1022/C.R.No. 262/22/Edu-2, dated 12/09/2022 **(Annexure – S).**
- 1.1.5 Instructions in this information brochure regarding admission process are liable to change based on any order / instruction / rules / directions by National Medical Commission (NMC) / Central Government / State Government / Hon’ble Supreme Court and Hon’ble High Court from time to time.



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## 1.2 CLARIFICATION:

NEET-PG is an eligibility-cum-ranking examination prescribed as a single entrance examination to various MD/MS and PG Diploma Courses as per section 61(2) of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019 read with section 10 (D) of Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.

No other Entrance Examination, either at State or institution level, shall be valid for entry to MD/MS/PG Diploma Courses for academic session 2022. Qualifying NEET PG is mandatory for entry to various MD/MS/PG Diploma Courses in the State of Maharashtra.

1.2.1 **SCOPE OF NEET-PG 2022:-** NEET PG 2022 shall be single eligibility cum entrance examination for admission to various Postgraduate Medical Courses for the academic session 2022-23, which will include the following.

- All India 50 % Quota Seats for MD/MS/PG Diploma Courses.
- State Quota seats for MD/MS/PG Diploma Courses in Government/ Corporation and Government Aided Medical Colleges situated in the State of Maharashtra.
- MD/MS/PG Diploma Courses Seats at All Unaided Private and Minority Medical Colleges/ Institution situated in the State of Maharashtra.

1.2.2 For admission to 2022-2023 academic session, online NEET PG 2022 examination has been conducted by NBE Authority appointed by Government of India, New Delhi.

- The validity of result of NEET PG 2022 shall be only for current admissions session i.e. 2022, for MD/MS/PG Diploma courses and cannot be carried forward for the next session of admission for MD/MS/PG Diploma courses.

1.2.3 In the state of Maharashtra, the Government of Maharashtra has established “ADMISSION REGULATING AUTHORITY AND STATE COMMON ENTRANCE TEST CELL” as per the provisions of Maharashtra Unaided Private professional educational institutes (Regulation of Admission & Fees) Act. 2015, (herein after “the act”).

1.2.4 The allocation of seats for MD/MS/PG Diploma courses for academic year 2022-2023 in various medical Institutions/Medical colleges under ambit of PG course Regulations shall be undertaken as per procedure prescribed in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations published by the NMC / erstwhile MCI.



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1.2.5 **For admission to Medical Postgraduate courses at all Government/ Corporation/Government aided/Unaided Private and Minority medical colleges (Excluding Deemed University) in the State of Maharashtra for State Quota, including institutional quota, State Merit list of eligible candidates will be prepared by the Competent Authority of the State of Maharashtra on the basis of NEET-PG 2022 examination.**

1.2.6 The list of Medical colleges / Institutions conducting post graduate Medical courses where admission will be carried out by State CET Cell for academic year 2022-23 is listed in **(Annexure ‘E’)**. The procedure adopted by State CET cell will be called as “Procedure for selection and admission to Medical Postgraduate Courses at the Government / Corporation / Central Government Institute for State Quota / Government aided / Unaided Private and Minority Medical Colleges” through merit list of NEET-PG 2022.

1.2.7 This procedure is applicable only to the seats at disposal of Competent Authority, STATE CET CELL, for Government/Corporation / Government aided / Unaided Private and Minority Medical colleges in the academic year 2022-2023. **No promise is implied therein for subsequent years and no expectations should be based on this procedure for future.**

**2. DEFINITIONS** of important terms are given in **Annexure “A”**

**3. COMPETENT AUTHORITY:**

The Commissioner, State CET Cell, Mumbai has been designated as Competent Authority for selection and admissions at (i) Government/ Corporation / Government Aided Medical colleges and (ii) Unaided Private & /Minority Medical colleges for the year 2022-2023, as per provisions of section 2(e) and section 10(4) of the Act (for Unaided Private & Minority Medical colleges) and Government Resolution No. MED-1015/CR 396/15/Edu-2, dated 16/12/2015 (for Government / Corporation Medical Colleges) **(Annexure – W).**

These admissions will be done on the available postgraduate seats at disposal of Competent Authority in State Quota Seats of Government/Corporation/ Government Aided / State Quota seat for Central Government/Unaided Private & Minority Medical Colleges from the State of Maharashtra. The Competent Authority will supervise and control the selection process by implementing these procedures.



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The Competent Authority will issue necessary executive instructions for implementation of these procedures and provide relevant information to be published or communicated. The Competent Authority will declare time-table, details of the date(s) of various procedures relating to admission process, in consultation with Nodal officer.

**4. AUTHORITY:**

**4.1 Nodal Officer:** Director of Medical Education and Research, Mumbai will act as Nodal Officer to advice and assist this admission process.

**4.2 Physical Document verification Centers:**

These Centers will be responsible to carry out the instructions given by the Competent Authority in respect of Online / Offline (physical) Document verification process. The list of the centers will be notified in due course.

**5. GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL AUTHORITY (IN GENERAL)**

As per section 9 of the Act, any grievance regarding the admission process will be dealt by the Commissioner, State CET Cell.

**6. LIST OF MEDICAL POSTGRADUATE COURSES:**

The list of available Medical Postgraduate Degree/Diploma courses along with code numbers are given in **Annexure-“B”**.

**7. DISTRIBUTION OF PG MEDICAL SEATS IN (A) GOVERNMENT/ CORPORATION / GOVERNMENT AIDED MEDICAL COLLEGES, AND (B) UNAIDED PRIVATE AND MINORITY MEDICAL COLLEGES.**

**(A) Government/Corporation/Government Aided Medical Colleges:**

7.1 The seats available for admission to Medical Postgraduate courses through NEET-PG 2022 will be from Institutions located in the State Maharashtra i.e. Government/Corporation medical colleges and the State quota seats of the Central Government and Government Aided institutions.

7.2 The seats available for admission to medical postgraduate courses will be distributed as 50% to All India Quota & remaining 50 % to the State Quota. From the State quota, 50% of Seats in post graduate diploma courses from State Government/Corporation Medical Colleges will be reserved for In-service candidates in the State Government services, who have served for at least 3 years in remote and/or difficult areas. For In-service quota reservation, any change made by Government from time to time will be applicable. The additional weightage for In-service candidates will be given as per clause 9 (IV) & (VII) of Post Graduate Medical Regulation 2000 of NMC / erstwhile MCI and as per Public Health Department Government Resolution No. MMO-2019/C.R.165/Service-3, dated 19<sup>th</sup> March 2019 and G.R issued in this regard from time to time. 5% of available seats in



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Postgraduate courses in Government and Government Aided institutions will be reserved for Person with Disability (PWD) candidates as per **Annexure “D”**. 1% of available postgraduate seats are reserved for Orphan category candidate. There will be constitutional reservation applicable in Available State quota seats, (after excluding All India Quota) as mentioned in **Annexure “C”**. The parallel (Horizontal) reservation will be applicable for In-service quota seats, PWD quota seats and Orphan quota seats in Government and Government Aided institutions.

- 7.3 All India quota seats in Government/Corporation medical colleges (i.e. 50% seats of the intake capacity) for post-graduate courses will be filled by the Competent Authority appointed by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, through merit list of All India NEET-PG 2022.
- 7.4 The seat position for Maharashtra State Quota admissions under NEET-PG 2022 of Government and Corporation medical colleges will be displayed on the website **www.mahacet.org** in due course.
- 7.5 The institute wise, course wise Intake Capacity of the seats will be as per Postgraduate Regulation of NMC / erstwhile Medical Council of India (MCI) and Maharashtra University Health Services (MUHS), Nashik.
- 7.6 The seats available will be filled in, on the basis of State Merit list of NEET-PG 2022. There will be constitutional /EWS/ Person with disability (PWD) / Orphan reservation in these seats as per Government orders issued from time to time (**Annexure “C, D & Z”**).
- 7.7 As per Government letter no. MED-1018/C.R.201/18/Edu-2 dated 31<sup>st</sup> January 2022 and G.R. No. – Orphan – 2018/C.R. 182/Ka-03 dated 23<sup>rd</sup> August 2021 of Women and Child Development Department, One percent of available postgraduate seats are reserved for Orphan category candidate (**Annexure “Z”**)
- 7.8 **EWS CATEGORY RESERVATION:** 10% seats of the available seats shall be reserved for candidate belonging to EWS category. (**Annexure “AA”**).
- 7.9 AIQ seats will not be reverted back to the respective States after the completion of AIQ Round 2 in compliance of the Order dated 16/12/2021 in Special Leave to Appeal (C) No(s).10487/2021 before the Hon’ble Supreme Court of India (**Annexure “T”**).
- 7.10 If the seats reserved for State In-service quota in the particular Constitutional reserve category remain unfilled on account of unavailability of candidate(s) after inter-se as per rules amongst In-service candidates,



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the remaining seat(s) shall be included in the respective Constitutional reserve category and these seats will be distributed to Non-in-service candidates using NEET-PG 2022 merit list.

- 7.11 Postgraduate seats left unfilled in an academic year, shall not be carried forward to the next or subsequent academic year. The last date of joining MD/MS/Diploma courses is as per the guidelines of NMC / erstwhile MCI Gazette of India, dated 20/02/2018 (**Annexure- CC**) & the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in W.P. (C) 76/2005 and W.P. 314/328 of 2015, dated 18/01/2016 (Ashish Ranjan and other V/s Union of India). The academic year will start as per the guidelines from NMC.
- 7.12 The validity of All India Rank based on result of NEET PG 2022 shall be only for current admission session i.e. 2022 for MD/MS/Diploma courses and cannot be carried forward for the next session of admission for MD/MS/Diploma Courses.

**B) Unaided Private and Minority Medical Colleges:**

- 7.13 The postgraduate seats of unaided Private & Minority Medical Colleges from State of Maharashtra will be filled through State Competent Authority of NEET-PG 2022.
- 7.14 The seats available for admission to Post Graduate Medical Courses shall be as stipulated by the appropriate authority and declared by Government from time to time.
- 7.15 In unaided Private medical Colleges and Minority Medical Colleges, 50% seats are state CET cell quota seats and remaining 50% seats are institutional quota seats including NRI quota seats. All these seats shall be filled by State Competent Authority NEET-PG 2022. In Institutional quota, maximum 15% of the seats may be filled in, from the NRI candidates.
- 7.16 In unaided private institutions, constitutional reservation is 25 % of total sanctioned intake as per the Maharashtra Government Notification Medical education Drugs department, No. PGM-1006/3207/CR-362/06/EDU-2, dated 8<sup>th</sup>, January 2007 as mentioned in **Annexure "C"**.
- 7.17 The institute wise availability of the seats will be as per Postgraduate Regulation of NMC / erstwhile MCI and MUHS, Nashik.
- 7.18 The seats available at disposal of Competent Authority for admission to Medical postgraduate courses through NEET-PG 2022 are inclusive of Institutional Quota from Unaided Private (including Minority) Medical Colleges as decided by concerned Authorities. The subject wise and college wise seat position will be made available on the website [www.mahacet.org](http://www.mahacet.org) in due course.



7.19 Postgraduate seats left unfilled in an academic year, shall not be carried forward to the next or subsequent academic year. The last date of joining MD/MS/Diploma courses is as per the guidelines of NMC / erstwhile MCI Gazette of India, dated 20/02/2018 (**Annexure - CC**) & the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in W.P (C) 76/2005 and W.P.314/328 of 2015 dated 18/01/2016 (Ashish Ranjan and other V/s Union of India). The academic year will start as per the guidelines from NMC.

7.20 The validity of all India rank based on result of NEET PG 2022 shall be only for current admission session i.e. 2022 for MD/MS/Diploma courses and cannot be carried forward for the next session of admission for MD/MS/Diploma Courses.

**8. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR NEET-PG 2022 MEDICAL POSTGRADUATE COURSES :**

8.1 Candidate must be an **Indian National**. Nationality Certificate issued by District Magistrate or Additional District Magistrate or Chief Metropolitan Magistrate or valid passport or School Leaving Certificate of HSC/12th Std. indicating the nationality of the candidate as "Indian" shall constitute the proof of nationality.

**Non Resident Indians (NRI) are not eligible for any other seat except NRI quota seats in Unaided Private and Private Minority Medical Colleges, subject to fulfillment of NRI status and other relevant eligibility criteria. (Annexure – O)**

**Non Resident Indians (NRI) are eligible only for maximum 15% NRI Quota seats in the Unaided Private/Minority medical colleges.**

**Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) / Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) are NOT ELIGIBLE for any seat under Competent Authority, State CET Cell.**

8.2 All candidates, who have passed final M.B.B.S degree course examination from the college situated in Maharashtra State and completed one year internship training by 31<sup>st</sup> July 2022 from a recognized medical college (**Annexure-F**) included in the Schedule as per provisions of the NMC act, 2019 and the repealed Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 are eligible. The Medical College should have been affiliated to the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences or Medical College affiliated to Deemed University as per University Grant Commission Act of 1956 under section 13/A, situated in the State of Maharashtra. The candidate who has obtained provisional or permanent registration either from the National Medical Commission (NMC)/ erstwhile MCI or Maharashtra Medical Council (MMC) or other state



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Council will be eligible for registration for NEET-PG 2022. **Candidates who have passed MBBS examination from foreign University are not eligible for NEET-PG 2022 admission process under Competent Authority, State CET Cell.**

- 8.3 The candidates who are domiciled in the State of Maharashtra and who have obtained admission under 15% All India quota / AIIMS / Central Government Institutions for MBBS course in the medical college / institution situated outside Maharashtra State and who have obtained the degree from a University situated outside the State of Maharashtra will also be eligible for selection process of NEET-PG 2022. Such candidates should submit (i) certificate from the Dean of respective medical college stating that the candidate was admitted under 15% all India quota / AIIMS / Central Government Institutions for MBBS course, and (ii) Candidate's Domicile certificate of Maharashtra State by virtue of residence.
- 8.4 The Candidate must be medically fit. **(Annexure-M)**
- 8.5 All Candidates desirous to take admission for MD/MS/PG Diploma courses under state quota or Institutional quota must have appeared for NEET-PG 2022 and declared eligible by the Competent Authority of NEET-PG 2022, Government of India, New Delhi.
- 8.6 **To be eligible for selection:**
- 8.6.1 To be eligible for selection to Medical Postgraduate courses a candidate belonging to **General Category and EWS category** must secure minimum of marks at 50<sup>th</sup> percentile and candidate belonging to **constitutional reservation category and constitutional reservation category with Person with disability (PWD) claim** must secure minimum of marks at 40<sup>th</sup> percentile in NEET-PG 2022. Person with disability (PWD) from general category and EWS category must secure minimum of marks at 45<sup>th</sup> percentile in NEET-PG 2022.
- 8.6.2 A candidate who fails to obtain the minimum eligibility percentile /marks as prescribed in regulations shall not be admitted to any Postgraduate courses in the said academic year 2022-2023.
- 8.6.3 However, the eligibility criteria decided by NMC / Government of India if revised will be applicable from time to time.
- 8.7 The NMC / erstwhile MCI / Maharashtra Medical Council / Other State Medical Council registration is mandatory for NEET-PG 2022 qualifying candidates. Registration certificate should be produced at the time of document verification process. A candidate without registration certificate will be held ineligible for admission.



- 8.8 **Candidates belonging to Backward Classes / EWS must have claimed so in his online registration for Maharashtra State quota, failing which such a claim will not be entertained subsequently.** Candidate belonging to above **Categories** should produce **Caste Certificate, Caste Validity Certificate and Non-Creamy Layer Certificate / EWS eligibility certificate (wherever applicable)** at the time of physical Document Verification process. Candidate who fails to produce above said certificates will be considered as **Open Category Candidate** provided he/she fulfills the eligibility criteria of NEET-PG 2022 during subsequent round(s).
- Candidates belonging to **EWS category will be required to produce Eligibility certificate for Economically Weaker Section in prescribed format issued by Concerned Authority, Government of Maharashtra for academic year 2022-23 (Annexure – "AA")**, at the time of physical document verification process. Candidate who fails to produce above said certificates will be considered as **Open Category Candidate** provided he/she fulfills the eligibility criteria of NEET-PG 2022.
- 8.9 Reserve category/EWS candidate must claim his category at the time of registration. A candidate belonging to a respective category but not having any physical document can also claim respective category reservation during online registration process; however he/she must produce the said certificates at the time of physical Document Verification process and at the time of joining at the allotted college so as to avail respective category claim.
- 8.10 **A Candidate belonging to ‘Creamy Layer’ amongst the categories (VJ) DT-A, NT-B, NT-C, NT-D, OBC and SBC must note that the provision of reservation is NOT applicable to him / her. A candidate claiming benefit of reservation under these categories will be required to produce Non-Creamy Layer Certificate as specified in the Government Resolutions from time to time. The certificate in prescribed Proforma stating that it is valid up to 31/03/2023 or later, should be submitted at the time of physical document verification process.**
- 8.11 In view of Hon’ble Supreme Court order dated 06/09/2017 in CA 11234-48 of 2017, it is mandatory to submit Caste Validity Certificate.



- 8.12 **Candidates who have passed postgraduate diploma course** will be eligible for admission to **postgraduate degree course in the same subject only** through NEET-PG 2022. (For exception, refer to clause No. 8.18.9)
- 8.13 As per circular dated 01<sup>st</sup> November 2011 issued by Directorate Medical Education Research, Mumbai, a candidate who has completed MBBS course from Government/ Corporation/Government Aided Colleges has to complete bond service as per the rules and regulations framed by State Government from time to time. Such a candidate can appear NEET PG examination without completion of UG bond, only for two years. After these two years, a candidate is not eligible for admission through for NEET PG unless he/she completes UG bond service. Such a Non-eligible candidate has to pay bond penalty amount to the Dean before document verification; otherwise he/she will be treated as ineligible for selection. For calculating two attempts, the calendar years will be considered irrespective of whether the candidate has appeared or not for the NEET PG examination. Candidate has to upload /produce bond release certificate during online Uploading/(physical) Document verification Process. **All the candidates who have completed the Internship on or before 31/03/2020 are not eligible for admission process through NEET - 2022 unless he/she has Bond release certificate on the day of document verification process. (Annexure – BB).**
- 8.14 As per Government Resolution No. MEDD/ 1017/CR171/17/Edu-2, dated 12/10/2017 and its amendment dated 24/11/2017, the Government of Maharashtra has made one year bond service compulsory for MBBS Graduates who have completed MBBS from Government / Corporation Medical Colleges in the State of Maharashtra. These Government Resolutions are stayed by Hon'ble High Court, Mumbai in W.P No.3035 of 2019 and clarified that such condition would be applicable to all such candidates who have taken admission for their undergraduate course after 12<sup>th</sup> October 2017. The Government of Maharashtra has challenged Hon'ble High Court, Mumbai order in Hon'ble Supreme Court by S.L.P (Civil) No 0226100 of 2019 in write petition No. 3035/2019. The said SLP is pending before Hon'ble Supreme Court. Any order passed in this SLP will be implemented in due course. **(Annexure - P).**
- 8.15 The candidate has to fulfill qualifications and eligibility criteria as notified by Central Government /NMC from time to time.



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### 8.16 Eligibility for In-Service Candidates:

8.16.1 Eligibility for in-Service candidates will be as per criteria laid down by the Public Health Department of State of Maharashtra for In-service Medical Officers. As per Public Health Department Government Resolution No. MMO-2019/C.R.165/Service-3, dated 19<sup>th</sup> March 2019 and or any Government Resolution issued from time to time **(Annexure-U)**

8.16.2 In-Service candidate desirous to claim In-Service quota seat shall obtain No Objection Certificate from their establishment for admission process.

8.16.3 In service quota candidate must have appeared for NEET-PG 2022, and declared eligible by Competent Authority, Government of India, New Delhi.

8.17 Candidates for post-graduate medical courses shall be selected strictly on the basis of their NEET-PG merit. However as per clause 9 (IV) & (VII) of NMC/erstwhile MCIPG regulation 2000, in determining the merit of eligible In-Service candidates under Government/Public authority, weight-age in the marks may be given by Public Health Department as an incentive at the rate of upto 10% of marks obtained for each year of service in remote and/or difficult areas maximum of 30% of marks obtained in NEET-PG 2022. The remote and difficult areas shall be as notified by Government of Maharashtra from time to time. The decision in this regard taken by The Directorate, Public Health Department, Government of Maharashtra will be final.

**In-service candidate will also be covered by relevant general eligibility criteria.**

8.18 **Non-eligibility of Candidate:** The following candidates are not eligible for admission process through NEET-PG 2022.

8.18.1 Candidates who have passed Final MBBS examination from institute located outside Maharashtra, except candidates who are Domicile of Maharashtra and selected under 15% all India quota / AIIMS / Central Government Institution (Ref. Rule 8.3).

8.18.2 **NRI candidates are not eligible for seats in Government/Corporation Medical Colleges, State quota of Central Government Medical Colleges/Government aided colleges/State CET Cell quota seats (including Institutional quota) of Unaided Private and Minority Medical Colleges. However, they are eligible for NRI quota seats of Unaided Private and Minority Medical Colleges.**



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- 8.18.3 **PIO/OCI/ Foreign national candidates are not eligible for any seat through this process, in the State of Maharashtra.**
- 8.18.4 **Candidates who have not appeared for NEET-PG 2022 conducted by Competent Authority, Government of India, New Delhi.**
- 8.18.5 Candidates who are not completing internship on or before 31<sup>st</sup> July 2022.
- 8.18.6 Candidates appeared for NEET-PG 2022 after previous 2 attempts in NEET PG and have not completed one year of bond service as per Government of Maharashtra rule and/or not received bond release certificate by paying bond penalty amount. (Refer rule 8.13)
- 8.18.7 Candidates who have not obtained NMC (erstwhile MCI)/Maharashtra Medical Council / Other State Medical Council registration before the date of physical document verification process.
- 8.18.8 Candidates who had been admitted to PG course through State quota in previous two academic years and resigned / left /not joined which **resulted in lapse of a seat.**
- 8.18.9 Candidates who are previously registered and are pursuing / have completed the PG degree course or have obtained PG degree are not eligible for admission through NEET PG 2022. This prohibition will apply to Post Graduate admission in Government/ Corporation run Medical College(s) only. However candidates who have completed PG course in one broad specialty is eligible for any other broad specialty in Private Unaided Medical College(s) as per Hon'ble High Court Order Dated 02/04/2018 in W.P. No.2388 of 2018 and Government of Maharashtra Letter No. WPM-1318/C.R 122/18 /EDU-2, Dated 27/03/2018.
- 8.18.10 Candidates who are registered for PG diploma and pursuing the course.
- 9.** There shall be no admission of students in respect of any academic session beyond **cut-off date as prescribed by NMC** for postgraduate courses under any circumstances. The University shall not register any student admitted beyond the said date.
- 10.** The NMC may direct, that any student identified as having obtained admission after the last date for closure of admission be discharged from the course of study, or any medical qualification granted to such a student shall not be a



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recognized qualification for the purpose of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956. The institution which grants admission to any student after the last date specified for the same shall also be liable to face such action as may be prescribed by NMC.

**11. ONLINE REGISTRATION, ADMINISTRATIVE FEES, SECURITY DEPOSIT, UPLOADING DOCUMENTS & PREPARATION OF PROVISIONAL MERIT LIST**

Admission process of NEET PG 2022 State Quota Seats will be carried out as per Gazette Notification No. MCI-18(1)/2018-Med./100818, dated 5<sup>th</sup> April 2018 (**Annexure “Y”**),

11.1 The Competent Authority shall issue Notice regarding schedule of online registration and submission of online Application from eligible candidates for the preparation of provisional state merit list for admission to postgraduate courses of state quota seats in State of Maharashtra. Candidate who has appeared for NEET-PG 2022, and desirous for admission to state quota seats of Maharashtra state, should submit online application form for Round-1 and / or Mop up Round, which will be made available on website "www.mahacet.org". Candidate can register fresh for Mop up Round even if he/she has not registered for Round-1. If deposit of a candidate is forfeited as per rule no 11.3, he/she can register again for Mop up Round by paying the requisite application form fee and deposit. The candidates will be required to submit **single prescribed online application form (ANNEXURE "H" Specimen Copy of online application)**. **Candidates submitting this application form will only be considered for subsequent admission process of NEET-PG 2022. The online Application Form will be common for Government / Corporation/ Government Aided and Unaided Private / Minority Institutions and all the seats available under Competent Authority. In-Service candidates who wish to seek admission for the postgraduate courses shall apply online at par with other Non In-Service candidates and claim In-service quota. The candidate claiming in-service quota seat must claim in the online application form.**

11.2 In-Service candidates may kindly note that online registration and submission of online application of NEET-PG 2022 does not confirm any automatic right to secure a postgraduate seat from in-service quota. The selection and admission is subject to the fulfillment of eligibility criteria as prescribed by concerned establishment i.e. Director of Health services



Government of Maharashtra. Competent Authority shall not be responsible, if such in-service candidates are refused for admission on account of non-eligibility of In-service candidature, under In-service Quota.

11.3 Cost of online application form fee of NEET-PG 2022 is Rs. 3000/-. This application fee is not refundable, hence candidates are advised to go through the Information Brochure and ascertain the eligibility before paying fee. It is sole responsibility of candidate to ascertain online payment of fees within prescribed period, failing which online application will be rejected.

Along with Application form fee of Rs. 3000/-, each and every candidate will have to pay Refundable security deposit as shown in the following table.

Candidate paying deposit as per column (1) will be allowed to fill preferences of Government / Corporation / Government Aided Institutes only. Candidate paying deposit as per column (2) will be allowed to fill preferences of all the institutions i.e. Government / Corporation / Government Aided Institutes and Unaided Private / Minority institutes. Candidate should decide well in advance regarding payment of deposit. No extension will be allowed for payment of deposit after the last date of registration.

This deposit will be utilized at the end of round 2 and subsequent rounds as described below and as shown in **Table 2**.

Refundable security deposit will be refunded at the end of the admission process of NEET PG 2022 to the same account /card of the candidate from which payment had been made. This is applicable to those candidates who have joined the allotted college or if candidate did not get any seat during the entire process of counseling.

Refundable security deposit will be forfeited where:

- a candidate has been allotted a seat in round 2 or subsequent rounds and does not report at allotted college to complete the admission process, or



- a candidate has resigned upto round 2 or subsequent rounds after joining (Including the candidate who has filled SRF in Round 1)
- if the admission gets cancelled due to any reason e.g. in case the candidate gives wrong information at the time of registration on the basis of which a seat may be allotted and later cancelled by the admission authorities at the time of reporting or fails to produce the required documents at the time of admission.

Following conditions will be applied for this refundable security deposit.

If deposit of a candidate is forfeited at the end of Round 2, such a candidate if wishes to participate in Mop up round(s), he/she will have to



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register again by paying Application form fee of Rs. 3000/-, and the necessary deposit as stated in the above table again.

- 11.4 Online application Form will be made available for Round-1 and Mop Up Round, and will be notified in due course by State CET Cell. Before filling Online Application form, candidate should download information brochure of NEET-PG 2022 and read the same carefully. The Applicants must possess the required criteria and educational qualification as mentioned in the Information Brochure of NEET-PG 2022.

**Online application form filling process:**

The details of online form submission process will be published in Notice and made available on website [www.mahacet.org](http://www.mahacet.org) as mentioned below.

**‘Apply Online for NEET-PG 2022’** Link will be available on website [www.mahacet.org](http://www.mahacet.org). Click on the above Link.

- a) Application form link will be displayed. Click on Application form link.
- b) Instruction page will be displayed. Carefully read the Instructions for filling online form (**Annexure "G"**). After reading Instructions, applicant has to click NEXT button to go to actual Online Application form (Annexure "H" a specimen copy of online application form)
- c) Candidate should fill required information in application form along with active mobile number and email address. Candidate will receive OTP on registered Mobile Number & Email address for facilitating registration for NEET PG 2022.
- d) Candidate should fill all the entries in application form.
- e) System will validate required fields before allowing him / her to submit.
- f) Before submission of Application Form, the candidate should read carefully the conditions given under **"Declaration by the Candidate."** Candidate should agree to the below given conditions, before submitting the application form.

**"Declaration by the candidate"**

- i) I hereby solemnly and sincerely affirm that each and every statement made and the entire information given by me in the application form is true and correct.
- ii) I have not concealed any material information, however if any information submitted herein is found fraudulent, incorrect or untrue. I understand that I am liable to criminal prosecution and I also agree to forgo my seat in Medical Postgraduate course. I also understand that my selection and admission to the course is also liable to be cancelled.



iii) I have carefully read the rules & regulations of NEET-PG 2022 brochure and I agree to abide by them. Hereby accept in entire the legality, validity and correctness of these rules. I understand by submitting this application I have accepted the correctness, validity and/ or justifiability of all these and that had I not accepted the correctness and validity of these rules, I would not have submitted this application and further that it will not be open hereinafter to challenge and/or question validity and/ or correctness of any rule or part thereof.

iv) I undertake to submit all the required original certificates at the time of physical Document verification process as well as at the time of admission to a course/college as per the rules, failing which I understand that my claim for selection shall not be granted.

If candidates agreed for aforesaid conditions, then only he should click the "I Agree" Button so that his application form will be accepted.

g) During submission the system will ask **"Password"** to the candidate.

h) Eligible Candidate will be able to submit the form. **There is provision to make changes in the Application Form before Click on Submit Button. Candidate should verify the correctness of entries made in application form. There is no provision to make changes in the application form once Submit Button is clicked.**

i) After submission of form candidate has to pay Non Refundable online prescribed fee Rs. 3000/- and deposit as per rule no. 11.3 through payment gateway provided for it.

j) Candidate should take printout of Receipt of online fee payment and the deposit.

k) **'Log In'** Link will be available on website **www.mahacet.org** to verify the application Form.

l) Candidate should **login** with Application No. (User Name) and his/her unique Password to download the printout of Application Form. Candidate has to preserve the downloaded printout of Application Form for subsequent use.

m) Applicants need not send copy of Application Form or any Document to this office.

n) Please note that if you commit any mistake in filling the online Application Form, it cannot be corrected by this office. The office will take no responsibility of any kind for such applications.

Candidate should preserve the (i) Receipt of online fee payment. (ii) Copy of downloaded Online application form (iii) downloaded copy of Information Brochure for subsequent use.

o) **Uploading of Documents:** After successful online payment, Candidate has to upload scan copy of required documents in due course before the day of admission.



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## 12. ONLINE DOCUMENT UPLOADING PROCESS & THE LIST OF DOCUMENTS FOR UPLOADING:

12.1 Online document uploading will be on the same website and on his/her user name and password.

12.2 Candidate has to upload all the relevant documents on this site under following head as listed below.

- ix. Certificate from Head of Institute showing that the Medical College/ Institute from which the candidate has passed MBBS examination is recognized by NMC/erstwhile Medical Council of India.
- x. Medical Fitness Certificate (as per **Annexure – M**)
- xi. Copy of Receipt of online fee payment of Rs. 3000/- and deposit.

### If applicable...

- xii. Caste Certificate
- xiii. Caste Validity Certificate.
- xiv. Non-Creamy Layer Certificate {for (VJ) DT -A, NT-B, NT-C, NT-D, OBC&SBC Candidates} issued by appropriate authority as specified in the Government Resolutions from time to time and should be valid up to 31/03/2023 or later.
- xv. EWS candidates should produce eligibility certificate in prescribed format issued by appropriate authority, for academic year 2022-23.
- xvi. All India Quota / AIIMS / Central Government Institutes selection letter / letter from Dean/Principal stating that the Candidate was admitted for MBBS under 15% quota / AIIMS / Central Government Institution from All India Entrance Examination. (Refer Rule No.8.3 )
- xvii. For Persons with disability (PWD) Candidates - Medical Disability Certificate from certificate issuing authority.
- xviii. Bond release Certificate from DMER, Mumbai (as per rule 8.13)
- xix. NOC from Directorate of Health Services (for in-service candidates)
- xx. Orphan Certificate from appropriate authority.

### 12.3 For Constitutional reservation category candidates: Ear-Marking -

Reserved category candidate entitled to admission on the basis of merit in an open category seat will have the option of taking admission either against his/her respective category seat or on an open category seat. If he/she opts



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for the reserved category, he/she will be deemed to have been admitted as an open category candidate and not as reserved category candidate. One seat in the college where he/she was eligible for admission against open seat shall be earmarked for a candidate belonging to the respective reserved category. Such earmarked seat will be made available immediately to the successive reserved category candidate from the same category merit.

#### 12.4 **Physical document verification process**

List of applicants will be published online on website. The schedule for physical document verification process will be notified by Competent Authority on website. As per this schedule, candidate should report to center for physical document verification. The details of centers will be published in due course. **At the time of physical Document Verification, the certificates which are uploaded during registration process will be verified with original documents.** This document verification process will be combined for admission to Government/Corporation/Government Aided and State quota seats of Central Government/Unaided Private/Minority Institutions from State of Maharashtra. This process is applicable for both general and In-Service candidates.

##### **Note:**

- 1) Reserved Category candidates who do not have Caste Validity Certificate at the time of Physical document verification process, will be considered as Open merit candidates subject to fulfilling eligibility.
- 2) (VJ)DT -A, NT-B, NT-C, NT-D, OBC and SBC category candidates who do not have Non Creamy Layer (valid up to 31/03/2023 or later) at the time of physical document verification process will be considered as Open Merit candidates subject to fulfilling eligibility. Such category candidates without validity and / or NCL, who are considered as Open Merit candidate will be made eligible, if he/she is otherwise eligible for open category.
- 3) EWS candidates who do not have EWS Eligibility Certificate, for academic year 2022-23 at the time of document verification process will be considered as open merit candidates subject to fulfilling eligibility.
- 4) Applicants belonging to SBC: The person belonging to Special Backward Class (SBC) is to be considered as OBC candidate and such candidate will be required to produce Non-Creamy Layer Certificate.

12.5 **Cut-off date for the eligibility:** The eligibility of the candidate shall be determined and/or decided for all purposes including for applicability of all these Rules and Regulations by considering the last date of physical document verification as the cutoff date. It is made abundantly clear that if a candidate is found ineligible as on the last date of document verification



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process, in terms of these Rules and Regulation, and if such an ineligible candidate acquires the requisite eligibility after the aforesaid cutoff date (i.e. the last date of document verification), such subsequent acquisition of eligibility will not make an ineligible candidate eligible for any purpose whatsoever, much less for the purpose of admission.

**12.6 PUBLICATION OF LIST OF APPLICANTS:** - On the basis of information submitted by the candidate(s) through online application, a list of applicants for Round 1 and Mop up Round will be prepared by the Competent Authority. This list will be published on the website of State CET Cell as per constitutional and/or specified reservation including In-Service & minority Status claimed by the candidates. However, the eligibility and final assigned category of candidate(s) will be subject to physical document verification at the time of document verification process.

**12.7 For In-Service candidates-** The list of applicants who are In-Service candidates will be forwarded to the respective establishment to decide the In-service quota eligibility and awarding incentive marks as per rule no 8.16 and clause 9 from P.G. Regulation 2000 of NMC (erstwhile MCI). All the In-service applicants of NEET PG 2022 should remain in contact with Directorate of Health Services (DHS) Authority for completing the formalities of Eligibility status of In-service applicants.

### **13. COMMON STATE MERIT LIST**

13.1 After receipt of the additional incentive marks with Eligibility Status of NEET-PG 2022 In-Service candidates as prescribed in clause 9 (IV) & (VII) of PG Regulation 2000 of NMC/ erstwhile MCI from the Directorate of Health Services (DHS) Government of Maharashtra, the Competent Authority will prepare and publish the Common State Merit List for Round 1 and Mop up Round on website of State CET Cell as per schedule.

### **14. ONLINE PREFERENCE FILLING PROCESS AND SELECTION PROCESS BY CAP COMPUTERISED ROUND: The details of State Quota seat matrix available for counseling and Schedule of online preference form filling process will be published in due course.**

14.1 Admission to postgraduate courses for academic year 2022-23, will be done online by way of filling of the online "Preference Form" on [www.mahacet.org](http://www.mahacet.org) (**Annexure- I**). There will not be any offline Preference Form filling process. Eligible merit listed candidates can fill online preference / choice form for Round-1, Round-2 and Mop Up Round separately. Candidate will be allowed to fill preferences of Govt., Corpn., Govt. aided and / or Unaided Private and Minority Institutions depending upon the deposit amount the candidate has paid during registration. Seat



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allocation shall be made centrally at a later date on the basis of NEET-PG 2022 merit in the state of Maharashtra, and preferences exercised by the candidate. For allocation of seat(s) during Round-1, Round-2 and Mop Up Round, preferences filled for Round-1, Round-2 and Mop Up Round will be considered respectively. **These preferences will not be carried forward for subsequent round(s) except Mop up Round preferences, which will be used for selection of Mop up round and Online Stray Vacancy round(s).** Those candidates who are responsible for lapse of PG seat for last two years are not permitted to apply for online preference filling process.

The candidate can fill online preference form multiple times before clicking submit button for Round-1, Round-2 and Mop up Round. Once submit button is clicked, then there is no provision to change the preference(s). The preference(s) filled will be used for selection of respective round(s) only except Mop up Round preferences, which will be used for selection of Mop up round and Online Stray Vacancy round(s)

- 14.2 There shall be two or more rounds of selection of candidates depending on the availability of vacant seats. The selection will be on the basis of merit and the preferences submitted by the candidate(s). For Round-2 and Mop up round, separate online preference(s) must be filled by the candidate. The preferences of courses and colleges once entered online shall be final and irrevocable for the respective round. This final data shall be used in selection process of respective round(s).

- 14.3 **The Subject & College combination code** is a four-digit number with **S or I or N suffix**, specific for each college & Subject combination. Candidate should fill minimum one preference and maximum as desired. It is not compulsory to fill all Preferences. The first two digit of the code indicates specific college / institution and last two digit indicates particular subject and suffix **S** indicates State quota (Government / Corporation Colleges & 50% each in Private Colleges/ Minority Colleges), **I** suffix indicates 35% Institutional quota in Private Colleges/ Minority Colleges and **N** suffix indicates 15% NRI quota in Private Colleges/ Minority Colleges.

**Government/Corporation/State quota seats of central Government colleges: All seats will be under State Quota and will have suffix 'S'.**

In Private and Minority Medical Colleges each preference code will have S/I/N suffix for e.g. Candidates are directed to fill the suffix carefully, as the fee structure of each quota is different.

- 14.4 **For preparing the preferences the required College Codes & Subject Codes are given in Annexure-B and Annexure-E.** For some of these codes the seat(s) may not be available during Round 1. In the subsequent rounds, some seats may become available on account of increased seats. ***Therefore, candidates who desire to opt for these seats can exercise the preference in the online preference form system for these seats considering eventuality of availability of such seats in subsequent rounds.***
- 14.5 The candidate should verify the fee structure of State/ Institutional / NRI Quota Seats prescribed by Fee Regulating Authority, before filling online preferences. The **FEE STRUCTURE** of Private and Minority medical colleges is available on website - [www.mahafra.org](http://www.mahafra.org)
- 14.6 The allotment of seats is based on the Preferences submitted by the candidate for the same college and same subject with the different suffix like 'S'/'I'/'N'.
- 14.7 It is recommended that candidates who wish to give Preference in same subject in the same college should give preferences considering fee structure in the sequence of first 'S' quota then 'I' quota and finally 'N' quota as per his/her order of Preference.
- Note 1: Candidate who is NRI or ward of NRI must claim NRI Status in online application form and should give preferences with suffix 'N'.
- Note 2: Candidates who are Not NRI or ward of NRI can give preferences for NRI quota seats in preference form with suffix 'N'. If seats remain vacant after allotting to NRI candidates, then it will be allotted as per merit to any eligible candidate who has given preference(s) for NRI seats with suffix N. However, he/she will have to pay fees fixed for NRI quota.
- 14.8 Candidate should fill his most preferred subject and college code as preference no. 1 followed by his next choice as preference no. 2 and so on. While filling the subject and college codes, four digit number with specific suffix should be entered in five boxes of NEET-PG 2022 preference form.



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14.9 Candidate must be very careful while filling the online preference form. Candidate can fill minimum one preference or any desired number of preferences for Round 1, Round-2 and Mop up Round of NEET-PG 2022.

14.10 If a candidate does not fill preferences for any of the round(s), i.e. Round-1, Round-2 and Mop up Round, then it is assumed that the candidate is not interested in that particular round of selection. No seat will be allocated to such candidate in that round. **Preferences of any of the previous Round(s) will not be carried forward for subsequent round(s) except for Online Stray Vacancy Round(s) after Mop up round.** i.e. Preferences filled for Round-1 will not be carried forward for Round-2, Mop up Round & Online Stray Vacancy Round(s) and preferences filled for Round-2 will not be carried forward to Mop Up Round and Online Stray Vacancy Round(s). Whereas preferences filled for Mop up Round will be considered for allocation of seats in Online Stray Vacancy round(s).

If a candidate does not give preference for a particular code (Government / Corporation / Private); then it means that he / she is not interested / desiring to take that PG seat. Candidate should note that there will be no change / addition / deletion in his / her list of preferences at later date / stage for that particular round.

14.11 **Selection Process (Refer Table No. 3 – Scheme of admission for State Quota seats NEET-PG 2022)**

14.11.1 For selection to Post-graduate Degree/Diploma course(s), candidates who have cleared NEET-PG 2022 are eligible. All such candidates will have to register during the stipulated period as per the Notice for NEET-PG 2022 admission process for the State Quota seats available with Commissioner State CET Cell. Candidate can register before Round 1 and MOP up Round. Once registered, that registration will be valid for all subsequent rounds.

14.11.2 There shall be two or more rounds of selection of candidates depending on the availability of vacant seats during subsequent round(s). The selection will be on the basis of merit and the preferences submitted by the candidate. Candidate will fill fresh choices for Round-1, Round-2 and Mop up Round separately. The choices filled for each round will be valid for that round only. Choices filled for respective round(s) will not



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be carried forward for any subsequent round(s) except Online and Stray Vacancy round(s) after Mop up round. While filling the online preference(s), candidates may kindly note that NEET-PG 2022 merit list will be operated from NEET-PG 2022 rank number one onwards in each round of selection. The online data of preferences of all candidates will be centrally processed at a later date for the selection of candidates for MD/MS/PG Diploma Courses.

- 14.11.3 **The selection list will be prepared as per NEET PG 2022 rank and on the basis of Preferences given by candidates in Preference form.** Based on preferences given, the seats will be allotted on merit and the allotment will be displayed on website of State CET Cell '[www.mahacet.org](http://www.mahacet.org)'. All the candidates to whom a seat has been allotted in Round 1 on the basis of Merit-cum-Preference will have to join the college and course so allotted, within prescribed period as per schedule by completing the requisite formalities. (i.e. submission of all original document and a set of attested photocopies of each documents as per the list given in NEET-PG 2022 Information Brochure and payment of requisite fees in respective institution) otherwise his/her selection will stand cancelled for that round.
- 14.11.4 The list of candidates selected for MD/MS/PG Diploma Courses shall be displayed at the website i.e. [www.mahacet.org](http://www.mahacet.org) as per schedule. List of selected candidates will also be sent to all concerned colleges. The candidate will have to report at the allotted college with his/her original documents for physical verification and admission. The candidate should report personally (**proxy not allowed**) to the respective allotted college, they should pay requisite fee and submit all original document at respective allotted college.
- 14.11.5 **Status Retention:** In case if a candidate to whom a seat has been allotted in the first round and who has joined the college accordingly, is satisfied with the allotment, such a candidate must submit a Status-Retention Form (**Annexure-L**) in the given format on or before prescribed date with the Dean/Principal of the College where such a seat has been



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allotted to such a candidate. The Dean/Principal of every Medical College in which admissions are so made in terms of these rules, may appoint an appropriate Officer to receive such Status Retention Forms. Upon receipt of such Status Retention Forms, an acknowledgement in writing shall be issued immediately to the concerned candidate(s) by the officer appointed by the Dean/Principal of the concerned college. It is mandatory for every such candidate submitting a Status Retention Form to insist for issuance of acknowledgement thereof and to preserve such acknowledgement till the present admission process is finally concluded. In absence of such an acknowledgement, the claim of submission of Status Retention Form within the prescribed time shall not be entertained. Candidate who has submitted status retention forms will not be eligible for remaining subsequent round(s).

**It is hereby made clear that the period provided for submission of Status Retention Form is crucial and vital. This period shall not be extended for any reason whatsoever. Submission of the Status Retention Form is an irrevocable and irreversible act for the candidate submitting such Status Retention Form. It is made clear that under no circumstances whatsoever, a candidate will be allowed to submit a Status Retention Form after the aforesaid last date. Under any circumstances whatsoever, a candidate who has submitted a Status Retention Form shall not be allowed to withdraw the same. All the candidates therefore, should take the note of this before submission of such a Status Retention Form.**

**Names of all the candidates who have submitted the Status Retention Form as above within the prescribed time and the seats occupied by them will be removed out of consideration for the remaining admission process for academic year 2022-23. Candidate joined during Round-1, and fills Status Retention form will be considered as Status Retention during Round-2 and “Free Exit” available for Round-1 selected candidates will not be applicable for such candidate.**



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It is hereby made abundantly clear that shifting on account of a better choice given by a candidate in Round-2, will be effected only and only if such a candidate is found entitled for 'change of Course' or a 'change of College'. Mere possibility of a 'change in category' on account of availability of seat in the same college and/or same course in Round-2 will not amount to "betterment" as such and therefore, no shifting will be effected in such an eventuality. Such a 'change in category' will include inter-alia change from reserved category to open category or vice-versa. The shift in such betterment shall be compulsory and mandatory for Round-2, except those who have filled Status Retention Form. Once status retention is submitted then there is no provision to withdraw or cancel the status retention.

- 14.11.6 All the institutions should inform the joining of the candidates and vacancies arising due to non-joining of the candidates and cancellations/status retention at their institutions after the last date of reporting of respective rounds, immediately to Maharashtra State CET Cell through online College feedback module.

The academic year will start as per the guidelines from NMC.

14.11.7 **Round-1 Process:**

If the candidate joins his/her Round-1 seat and wants to upgrade his/her allotted seat, then he/she shall NOT fill Status Retention Form and will have to fill fresh choice(s) for round-2.

If a Candidate joins and is satisfied with the seat allotted in Round-1 and is not willing for up-gradation in Round-2, he/she can fill Status Retention Form. Such a candidate will not be considered for any of the further round(s) during the admission process of NEET-PG 2022. However such a candidate can resign from the allotted seat before the prescribed/stipulated date and avail free exit (available only in Round-1). Such a candidate will be eligible for Round-2.

If the candidate is selected in Round-1 of counseling and does not report at the allotted institute, this will be considered as 'free exit' (option available only in round-1). No new registration



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is required. However, such a candidate may participate again in Round-2 after logging in with their earlier Registration details and filling fresh preference(s). His/her selection of Round-1 stands cancelled. The seat so allotted to such a candidate who does not join, will be presumed to be a vacant seat as on the last date of joining and from the next date after the date set out as the last date for joining the college in terms of such allotment. Such a vacant seat will be allotted in Round-2 of the admission process.

14.11.8 **Round-2 Process:**

**Available Seats for Round-2:**

- i. Seats not allotted during Round-1.
- ii. Seats vacant due to non joining / cancellation by candidate(s) allotted in Round-1.
- iii. Seats available due to up-gradation of candidate(s), who have been allotted during Round-1 and joined the seat.

Following types of Candidates are eligible for seat allotment in Round-2:

- a) Registered candidates who did not fill choices in Round-1.
- b) Registered candidates who participated in Round-1 but did not get any seat allotted in Round 1.
- c) Registered candidates, whose seat allotted in Round 1 got cancelled during the document verification due to his/her invalid/wrong claim on reporting for admission to the selected Institute, but candidate is otherwise eligible for selection with change in the invalid/wrong claim. For such a candidate, selection during first round will not be valid and he/she will be eligible only on available seats during second round with corrected claim.
- d) Candidates who have reported/joined at allotted institute during the joining period of round-1 of allotment and did not filled Status Retention Form.
- e) Candidate who does not join the allotted seat during Round-1.
- f) Candidate who has joined and resigned upto the last date of joining Round-1.



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Candidate will have to fill fresh choices for Round-2. Round-1 choices will be considered as null & void. If a candidate is not interested to participate in Round-2, he/she should not fill preferences for Round-2 and such a candidate who has joined during Round-1, will retain his/her Round-1 seat.

**The allotment of seat for Round-2 will be as per the merit and preference(s) filled by the candidates for Round-2.**

- **If a candidate joined during Round-1, is upgraded in Round-2, his/her allotted seat of Round-1 will be available in Round-2 and allotted as per merit in the same round. It is mandatory for the candidate to join the seat allotted in Round-2.**
- **If a candidate joined during Round-1 and does not get upgraded in Round-2 (no seat is allotted during Round-2), he/she will retain allotted seat of Round-1. Such a candidate will not get free exit after allotment of Round-2.**
- **Candidate with no seat in hand at the end of Round-2, will be eligible for Mop up Round(s).**
- **Candidate allotted a seat during Round-2, if does not join the allotted seat, such a candidate will not be eligible for Subsequent Round(s) and his/her deposit will be forfeited. If such a candidate wishes to apply for Mop up Round, he/she will have to register again by paying online registration fee and deposit as per rule no. 11.3.**

Following types of Candidates are not eligible for seat allotment in Round-2:

- Candidates who have joined Round-1 allotted seat and filled Status Retention Form.
- Candidates who have not filled fresh preferences.
- Candidate whose name appears in the list provided by MCC as joined candidates at the end of All India Round -2.

If a candidate is selected during Round-2, he/she will have to join the college / seat allotted during second round. After joining the allotted institute in Round-2 the candidate will not be eligible to participate in any further rounds of State Counseling Process. Names of such candidates will be informed to MCC for prohibiting them to participate in any Central counseling.



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If a candidate does not join the selected seat during round-2, he/she will not be eligible for further round(s) of selection and his/her deposit will be forfeited. If such a candidate wishes to apply for Mop up Round, he/she will have to register again by paying online registration fee and deposit as per rule no. 11.3.

**14.11.9 Mop-up Round Process:**

Available Seats for Mop up Round(s):

- i. Seats not allotted during Round-2.
- ii. Seats vacant due to non joining / cancellation by candidate(s) allotted in Round-2.

Following types of Candidates are eligible for seat allotment in Mop up Round:

- a) Registered candidates who did not fill choices in round 1 & round 2.
- b) Registered candidates who participated in round 1 & round 2 but did not get any seat allotted in round 1 & round 2.
- c) Candidates who have registered in Mop up Round.

Candidate will have to fill fresh preferences for Mop up Round. All previous preferences will be considered as null & void. These preferences will be used for all subsequent Online Stray Vacancy Round(s).

Candidates not eligible for Mop up round:

- Candidates who have joined seat in round-1 of State Quota seats and not participated in round-2.
- Candidates who have joined seat in round-2 of State Quota seats.
- Candidates who have joined status at the end of round-2 of All India Quota seats (as per Hon'ble Supreme Court order dated: 30/03/2022 in W.P No. 174 of 2022).

If a candidate is selected during Mop up Round, he/she will have to join the college / seat allotted during that round. Candidate selected during Mop up Round will not be eligible for subsequent Online Stray Vacancy round(s) of State Counseling Process.

**14.11.10 Online Stray Vacancy Round Process (for Govt. / Corpn. / Govt-aided institutions):**

Online Stray Vacancy Round will be conducted for Govt. / Corpn. / Govt-aided institutions online.

Eligible Candidates:

- Candidate who has registered & filled online preference form previously in Mop-up round of State Quota Counseling but not been allotted a seat till last Mop up round.



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**Candidates not eligible:**

- Candidates who have joined seat in Round-1 and Round-2 or allotted a seat in Mop-up round(s) of State Quota Seats.
- Candidates who have joined seat in Round-1, Round-2 & Mop-up round(s) of All India Quota seats.

**Note –**

- No new registration will be done for this round.
- No fresh choices will be allowed for this round and choices exercised for Mop-up round will be considered for allotment of seats for Online Stray Vacancy round(s).
- Allotment of seat will be done Online by running software.

**14.11.11 Institutional Stray Vacancy Round Process (for Unaided Private / Minority institutions):**

1. Institutional Stray Vacancy Round is only for Private Unaided/Minority Medical colleges and for seats remaining vacant after MOP UP Round.
2. Dean or the Principal of the Institutions shall carry out the admission of these vacant seats on the basis of inter-se merit from the list of NEET-PG 2022 eligible candidates as per the directions and schedule issued by the Competent Authority, State CET Cell, during the academic year 2022-23.
3. All those candidates joined during Round-1, Round-2 & Mop-up round in Govt. / Corpn. / Govt. aided / Private Unaided / Minority medical colleges and having admitted status as on prescribed date are not eligible to participate in institutional level stray vacancy round.
4. The list of eligible candidates for Institutional stray vacancy round (i.e. those who are having not admitted status as on prescribed date) will be published on the website: [www.mahacet.org](http://www.mahacet.org).
5. It will be responsibility of the institute to verify and ascertain eligibility of the candidate as per respective Central Council and NEET PG 2022 Information Brochure rules before admitting the candidate even if his/her name appears in list of ELIGIBLE candidates.
6. For institutional round, eligible and interested candidates should approach to the Dean/Principal of the respective college(s) within prescribed time and submit application for



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vacant seats in person or any other person with valid authority letter signed by the candidate. Such type of applications should not be submitted in the State CET Cell in person or via email. Such type of applications submitted in State CET Cell will not be considered valid for any institutional level admission process.

7. Any vacancy arising due to shifting of candidates from Private Medical College to Government/ Corporation Medical College in last Mop Up round and Online Stray Vacancy Round(s) can be filled by institution. Such vacancy should be immediately informed to the Competent Authority.
8. Any Candidate if Shifted from Private Medical College to Govt./ Corporation Medical College due to betterment or any reason by Order of Competent Authority, such Candidate, if desires should be immediately relieved without any penalty.
9. The admission process should be completed before Cut-off date prescribed for the Post-graduate course(s) that is declared by Central Council and Competent Authority from time to time.
10. All the admissions are subject to approval of Admissions Regulating Authority after Cut-off date. The College should upload the information about admitted candidate in College Feedback Module of State CET Cell.
11. Any issue regarding filling of vacant seats not dealt herein above will be dealt with, when arising fully and finally by the Competent Authority.

14.12 **In-Service vacant seats:** If these seats become available, will be filled by State CET CELL as per rules of state quota. For filling these seats, no fresh preference(s) will be called from the candidates. These seats will be added to the seat matrix and allotted as per the preferences (choices) already exercised by the eligible candidate(s) during online preference filling system for respective round(s).

14.13 **PWD vacant seats:** If the seats reserved for the person with disabilities in a particular category remain unfilled on account of unavailability of candidates the seats shall be included in the annual sanctioned seats for the respective category and allotted as per the preferences (choices) already exercised by the eligible candidate(s) during online preference filling system for respective round(s).



**For 60th and 65th Institutions – Selection for each EAP round will be online**

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## 15. SEAT DISTRIBUTION CHART:

15.1 The seat distribution of Government/Corporation/State quota seats of central Government institutions /Unaided Private and Minority medical colleges (excluding All India quota) for NEET-PG 2022 as per information submitted by college will be made available on website [www.mahacet.org](http://www.mahacet.org) which contains distribution of available seats.

15.2 The seats reserved for person with disability (PWD) candidates and In-service quota seats will be shown in the chart. The college-wise, subject-wise and category-wise distribution also will be available on website. It should be noted that eligible category candidates can avail open seat by virtue of merit. Category seats, if at all remain unclaimed by a particular category candidate, are made available to other categories & to open category candidates as per inter-se category round procedure.

**Seat distribution chart is subject to change as per instructions of NMC/ erstwhile MCI/ Transfer of PG Teacher/ affiliation from University etc.**

15.3 All the Courses are affiliated to The Maharashtra University Health Sciences, Nashik except Post Graduate Courses at Tata Memorial Hospital & BARC, which are affiliated to Homi Bhabha National Institute (HBNI) Mumbai (Central Deemed University).

15.4 **Person with disability (PWD):**

15.4.1 As per Medical Council of India, New Delhi amendment notification No: No. MCI-34(41)/2018-Med./170045. dated 5th February, 2019, Five (5%) seats of annual sanctioned intake capacity shall be filled up by candidates with specified benchmark disabilities contained in the schedule to the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016. The guidelines for admission of persons with Specified Disabilities published by Medical Council of India, New Delhi regarding PWD eligibility from time to time will be applicable (**Annexure – D**).

The specified disability categories as mentioned in the rights of persons with Disability Act 2016 are as follows.

1. Physical disability
2. Intellectual disability
3. Mental behavior disability
4. Disability caused due to chronic illness
5. Multiple disabilities



15.4.2 Candidate should mark as PWD on the online application form, failing which claim will not be granted. Candidate is required to submit the proof of his/her disability by way of a certificate issued by certificate issuing authority in the year 2022.

15.4.3 **Instructions to Person with Disability Candidates:** All qualified Persons With Disability PWD (PH) Category Candidates of NEET PG 2022 are advised to get themselves examined at any one of specified Medical Board to obtain Disability PWD (PH) Certificate in advance. Candidates, who have attended any one of these Medical Boards, should submit / upload the disability certificate as per the prescribed format during online uploading of certificates for document verification process.

15.5 Constitutional reservation in all the Government/Municipal Corporation colleges and State quota seats of Central Government and Government Aided Institution and colleges /Unaided private Medical Institutions will be as per NEET-PG 2022 Information Brochure.

#### **17. CONDITIONS TO BE SATISFIED BY CANDIDATE AFTER SELECTION:**

17.1 A candidate will have to pay the prescribed fees (i.e. tuition + deposit + others). In the form of separate Demand Drafts, (One for tuition fees and another for other fees) in favor Dean/Principal of concerned institution. He/she must deposit all relevant original certificates / documents in the concerned institution.

The fees for Government and Municipal Corporation Medical Colleges, Central Government Institutions / Medical Colleges who opt for Post graduate admission to PG courses through NEET-PG 2022 is as prescribed by Government from time to time.

17.2 The candidate will have to work as a Resident, under the Residency scheme, prescribed vide GR No.MED-1059/2116/CR-10/96/EDU, dated 31<sup>st</sup> Jan. 1996 and as amended from time to time. The candidate should have permanent MMC / NMC / erstwhile MCI registration.

17.3 All selected candidates will have to submit DD/Pay order of Rs. 650/- drawn on any nationalized / scheduled commercial bank in favor of **“NATIONAL INSURANCE COMPANY LIMITED, KOLHAPUR.”** payable at Kolhapur for Amartya Shiksha Yojana as per GR.MED/100/880 /CR-129/Edu-1, dated 13/10/2003. This DD/Pay order should submitted by the admitted candidate to the admitted Institution. The Institution should send this DD/Pay order to **“NATIONAL INSURANCE COMPANY LTD., Divisional Office, 205/B, E Ward, Cosmos Commercial Complex, New Shahupuri, Kolhapur, Maharashtra – 416001”.**

#### **18. CANCELLATION AND REFUND:**

18.1 Candidate who has confirmed his/her admission may cancel it on or before prescribed date which will be **declared by Competent Authority, by submitting** an application to the concerned Dean/Head of the institution. **(As per Annexure-K).**

18.2 Refund of fees by the college after change of college, course or cancellation of admission:

- a) On or before prescribed date Rs. 1500/- (Rs. One Thousand Five Hundred only) to be deducted and rest of the fees to be refunded.**
- b) After prescribed date - No refund.**



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- 18.3 **If a candidate expires** or becomes unfit to undergo PG course as per MCI/NMC Norms and decided by notified Medical Board within 3 months from the date of admission, full refund shall be made.

**19. CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE:**

- 19.1 Failure of the candidate in making full and correct statements in the application form and/or suppression of any information would lead to disqualification of the candidate, even at later date. Such a candidate will be debarred from the entire selection process.
- 19.2 It is responsibility of every candidate to submit proper documents. Any attempt to submit documents which are not genuine will lead to cancellation of the admission of the candidate, forfeiture of the fees, deposits and expulsion of the candidate from the college by the Competent Authority or by his authorized official. The name of such candidate(s) shall be deleted from the State Merit List and he/she will not be eligible for further rounds of the selection process and will be debarred from the selection process. If deemed fit even criminal proceeding may be initiated by the Competent Authority against such candidates/ their parents.
- 19.3 If any candidate / authorized representative or person accompanying is found obstructing the counseling and / or admission process, or trying to influence in unlawful manner/creating nuisance, the candidate shall be liable for disqualification from the process of selection and appropriate legal action will be taken. The decision taken by the Competent Authority in this respect shall be final and binding.
- 19.4 The registration once granted is valid only if the teacher and the Dean are satisfied about regularity, diligent pursuance of studies by the student as well as good conduct.
- 19.5 All candidates selected for admission shall be subject to the disciplinary rules of the Institution, MUHS, Nashik, NMC / erstwhile MCI and Government.
- 19.6 Concerned admitting University shall take the decision regarding eligibility, enrollment and registration and granting of the term of selected candidates. The selection of a candidate by the Competent Authority at a later date does not place any onus to accord approval for grant of term.
- 19.7 Canvassing directly or indirectly for the allotment of seat would disqualify the candidate for admission. Influencing the staff by unfair



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- means, will lead to cancellation of allotted seat and such candidate will also face disqualification for admission during next academic year.
- 19.8 A candidate selected for postgraduate course will not be allowed to change subject/college/institute on mutual basis as per the NMC / erstwhile MCI rules / MUHS regulations.
- 19.9 In case of dispute in the matter of allotment of seat / course / institution or any other matter pertaining to the provisional selection or cancellation of admission, the decision of the Competent Authority shall be final and binding.
- 19.10 All the terms and conditions of Unaided Private/ Minority Medical Colleges will be applicable and mandatory to follow by the selected candidate.
- 19.11 Before submitting the online preference form the candidates should go through the **website** of every **unaided private / Minority Medical College**, to know about their terms and conditions for admission.
- 19.12 **Legal Jurisdiction:** All disputes pertaining to the conduct of examination and selection process shall fall within the jurisdiction of courts in Mumbai only.

## **20. PENALTY & SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY SERVICE:**

### **For Government/Corporation/State quota of central Government Colleges.**

- 20.1 Candidate who has joined for postgraduate course either through All India Post Graduate quota or through NEET-PG 2022 state quota should complete Junior residency tenure, failing which he/she will be required to pay non-refundable Rs. 10,00,000/- (Rupees Ten Lacs Only) for non-completion of Junior residency tenure. However, this is not applicable to the candidates of NEET-PG 2022 resigning the PG admission before prescribed date, which will be notified in due course.
- 20.2 Any candidate admitted either through All India Post Graduate quota or through NEET-PG 2022 state quota responsible for lapse of post graduate medical seat will have to pay non-refundable additional penalty of Rs. 10,00,000/- (Rupees Ten Lacs Only). Such candidate will not be eligible for admission through State Quota for subsequent two academic years, i.e. NEET PG 2023 & 2024.
- 20.3 As per Government Resolution (G.R. No. MED 1010/CR-184/10/Ed-2, dated: 28<sup>th</sup> May 2010, and any G.R issued in this regard from time to time), candidate joining seat of Government/Municipal Corporation



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colleges for admission to Post graduation Courses either through All India Post Graduate quota or through NEET-PG 2022 state quota will be required to sign a bond to serve the Government of Maharashtra or local self-government or Defence services for a period of one year **(Social responsibility service)**, failing which he/she will be required to pay Rs. 50,00,000/- (Rupees Fifty Lacs only) for the default.

- 20.4 The candidates who have passed post graduate MD/MS/Diploma from Government / Corporation colleges, have to complete social responsibility service (bond) from either of the institution i.e. Government of India or its undertaking institute (situated within Maharashtra State) / Defence services / Maharashtra State services or its undertaking / local self-government bodies and their undertaking situated in the state of Maharashtra as per MEDD G.R. No. CET 3518/C.R.32/18/Edu-2, Dated: 29/01/2018 **(Annexure - V)**.
- 20.5 As per Government Circular No. CET 3518/C.R.182/18/Edu-2, Dated: 19/05/2018 Private Unaided Medical Institution(s) shall not demand Bank Guarantee equivalent to the fee amounting to next academic year(s) at the time of admission and Bond Service shall not be imposed after completion of Postgraduate course from the admitted candidates by Private Unaided Institutions **(Annexure - X)**.
- 20.6 Any candidate resigning a seat from Unaided Private / Minority Medical College after the prescribed date will have to pay three year's fees as a penalty.
- 21.** Any issue not dealt here-in above will be dealt with, when arising, fully and finally by the Competent Authority. Any amendment made by NMC / erstwhile Medical Council of India (MCI) / Central Government / State Government / Hon'ble Supreme Court and Hon'ble High Court from time to time, will be implemented.

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## ANNEXURE “A”

### DEFINITIONS

**Unless the context other requires,**

- (a) **“Act”** means the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. Act XXVIII of 2015);
- (b) **“Competent Authority”** means the Commissioner of State CET appointed by the Government under section 10, for conducting CET through **CAP** for the admissions into Private Professional Educational Institutions;
- (c) **“Admission Reporting Institution”** means an institution where the Candidate shall report for confirmation of admission by submission of documents and payment of fees;
- (d) **“Application Form”** means the prescribed form to be filled up for online or offline by the candidate for admission to the Courses as defined in clause (f);
- (e) **“CAP Seats”** means the seats filled in through the Centralized Admission Process(CAP) carried out by the Competent Authority;
- (f) **“The Common Entrance Test”(CET)**, for the purpose of the courses, means the "National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test (NEET-PG)" or "National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test (NEET-MDS)", as applicable to the respective Course.
- (g) **“The Courses”** means the Postgraduate Medical Courses, as the case may be, conducted in the State as per the approval of the MCI;
- (h) **“Document Verification Centre”** means the city or town where the document verification is to be conducted;
- (i) **“Foreign Student”** means a student who is not a citizen of India;
- (j) **“Non-Resident Indian (NRI)”** means a person who is “not ordinarily resident” under sub-section (6) of section 6 of the Income Tax Act, 1961, and includes a person resident outside India under clause (w) of section 2 of the Foreign Exchange Management Act, 1999, and also includes his child or ward;
- (k) **“Person of Indian Origin (PIO)”** means a person who is a citizen of a country other than India but who, at any time, was a citizen of India; or in whose case either parent or any grandparent was a citizen of India by virtue of the provisions of Part II of the Constitution of India or under the Citizenship Act, 1955;
- (l) **“Eligible Candidates”** means the candidates who are eligible for different professional courses as notified by the Government, from time to time, under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Act;
- (m) **“Internship”** means the compulsory rotating internship to be completed as per rules or regulations of the Medical Council of India (MCI) or the Dental Council of India (DCI) and the Maharashtra Medical Council (MMC) or the Maharashtra State Dental Council (MSDC) and the concerned University;
- (n) **“Inter-se-Merit”** means the order of merit in respect of various classes, category and candidature types of the Candidates determined by following the CET merit in accordance with these rules;



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- (o) **“Institutional Quota”** means the seats available for admission to eligible Candidates at Institution level as declared by the State Government or the appropriate authority, from time to time;
- (p) **“Minority Educational Institution”** means a Private Professional Educational Institution notified as such by the State Government, established and administered for and by the persons belonging to the minority community, domiciled in the State of Maharashtra, having right to do so under clause (1) of article 30 of the Constitution of India;
- (q) **“management”** means the managing committee or the governing body, by whatever name called, of the Private Professional Educational Institution to which the affairs of such Institution are entrusted and where such affairs are entrusted to any person, by whatever name or designation called, includes such person;
- (r) **“the MCI”** means the Medical Council of India constituted under the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (102 of 1956);
- (s) **“MCI regulations”** means the regulations of Medical Council of India made for the purposes of the Courses;
- (t) **“Minority Quota”** means the seats earmarked for the Minority Community students from within the State, belonging to the Minority Community to which the institution belongs;
- (u) **“The MUHS”** means the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences established under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Act, 1998 (Mah.X of 1999);
- (v) **“National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test (NEET-PG)”** or "NEET-PG" AND "National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test –NEET-MDS" or "NEET-MDS" means the eligibility cum ranking examination prescribed as the single central entrance examination conducted by the National Board of Examinations under section 10D of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (102 of 1956) or section 10D of the Dentists Act, 1948 (16 of 1948), for the purpose of admissions respectively to MD or MS or Postgraduate Diploma and MDS or Post Graduate Diploma Professional Educational Courses;
- (w) **“Registration”** means the registration of the qualification either with the MCI or the Maharashtra Medical Council (MMC) after completing 1-year compulsory rotating internship.
- (x) **“Nodal Officer”** means the Director of the Medical Education and Research
- (y) **“Private Professional Educational Institution”** means any college, school, institute, institution or other body, by whatever name called, conducting any professional course or courses approved or recognized by the appropriate authority and affiliated to any university, but shall not include,
- (i) any such institution established, maintained or administered by the Central Government, any State Government or any local authority;
- (ii) institution declared to be a deemed university under section 3 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956; or



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- (iii) a university to which the provisions of the University Grants Commission (Establishment and Maintenance of Private Universities) Regulations, 2003 are applicable;
- (z) **“Professional Education”** means any educational course of study declared and notified as such, from time to time by the Government which includes a course leading to the award of an Under Graduate or Post-Graduate degree, diploma, by whatever name called and recognized by the appropriate authority;
- (aa) **“Regulations”** means the regulations framed by the Regulating Authorities;
- (bb) **“Regulating Authority”** means the Admissions Regulating Authority under section 7 or the Fees Regulating Authority under section 11, as the case may be ;
- (cc) **“Sanctioned intake”** means the total number of seats sanctioned or approved by the appropriate authority for admitting candidates in a single academic year in each professional course of study or discipline in a Private Professional Educational Institution at the appropriate level of entry;
- (dd) **“unaided institution”** means Private Professional Educational Institution, which is not receiving aid or grant-in-aid from the Central Government, the State Government or the local authority;
- (ee) **“University”** shall have the same meaning as assigned to it in clause (f) of section 2 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956.
- (ff) **“EWS”** means Economically Weaker Section include person who are not covered under the scheme of reservation for SCs, STs, and OBCs and whose family has gross annual income below Rs. 8,00,000/- as per Government resolution of General Administration Department ROD-4019/C.R 31/ 16-A Dated 12 February 2019.
- (gg) **“Orphan”** means a child— (i) who is without biological or adoptive parents or legal guardian; or (ii) whose legal guardian is not willing to take, or capable of taking care of the child; as defined in Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) act 2015
- (hh) **“NMC”** means The National Medical Commission (NMC) has been constituted by an act of Parliament known as National Medical Commission Act, 2019 which came into force on 25.9.2020 by gazette notification dated 24.9.2020.

- 2) Candidates belonging to aforesaid Backward Class categories will be required to submit the Caste Certificate and the Caste/Tribe Validity Certificate.
- 3) Caste certificate issuing authority: - Caste certificate stating that the caste is recognized under a particular backward class category in Maharashtra state is issued by Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Executive Magistrate/Metropolitan Magistrate in Maharashtra state.
- 4) **The Caste/Tribe validity Certificate issuing Authorities are as follows: -**
- a) For Candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Caste converts to Buddhism, Vimukta Jati, Nomadic Tribes 1,2&3 and Other Backward Class, Caste Validity Certificate is issued by **Divisional Caste Certificate**



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**Scrutiny Committee of respective Divisional Social Welfare Office** (Konkan, Pune, Nashik, Aurangabad, Amravati and Nagpur).

- b) For Candidates belonging to Scheduled Tribe the Tribe Validity Certificate is issued by Director/Deputy Director, **Tribe Certificate Scrutiny Committee of respective Region** (Konkan, Pune, Nashik, Aurangabad, Amravati and Nagpur).

**5) The candidate should have claimed the constitutional reservation in the original application form.** The candidate claiming constitutional reservation must submit original **caste validity certificate at the time of counseling for filling preference form, failing which the category claim will not be granted.**

**6) NON-CREAMY LAYER**

A candidate belonging to 'Creamy Layer' amongst the categories (C) to (G) must note that the provision of reservation is NOT applicable to him/her. A candidate claiming benefit of reservation under the categories (C) to (G) above will be required to produce Non-Creamy Layer Certificate as specified in the Government resolution No.CBC-10/2008/CR-697/VJNT-1, dated 24th June, 2013. The certificate should be **valid upto 31/03/2023**. The Non-Creamy Layer Certificate is issued by Sub-Divisional Officer/Deputy Collector/Collector of the district.

However, such a Non-Creamy Layer Certificate shall be produced in any case at the time of filling up of Preference Form, failing which the category claimed will not be granted.

**Applicants belonging to Special Backward Class**

**N.B.: AS per the Maharashtra Government ACT NO. XXX of 2006 dated 1<sup>st</sup> August 2006 the candidate belonging to the Special Backward Category shall be considered from and out of their respective original / parent Reserved Category such as Other Backward Classes.**

- 7) Inter-se amongst the reserved categories will be operated at the end of each admission process against the unfilled reserved categories seats as per merit and choice of the reserved categories candidates.

The seats remaining vacant from various categories will be filled in during inter-se admission process as follows:

- a) From among the candidates of their respective group from the Inter-se State Merit List of that particular group where the vacancies exist.



**A -The groups are as follows -**

<b>GROUP - I</b> (i) Scheduled Castes and Schedule Caste converted to Buddhism (S.C.) (ii) Scheduled Tribes including those living out-side specified area (S.T.)
<b>GROUP - II</b> (i) VimuktaJati (VJ)(DT-A) (ii) Nomadic Tribes (NT-B)
<b>GROUP - III</b> (i) Nomadic Tribes (NT-C) (ii) Nomadic Tribes (NT-D) (iii) Other Backward Classes (OBC) including SBC

(b) If the seats still remain vacant, then the seats will be filled, from among the candidates of all the categories mentioned above from the all categories combined merit list.

(c) If the seats still remain vacant then the seats will be filled from among the candidates of the common merit list.

**B – The seats remaining vacant of EWS category will be filled from among the candidates of the Common merit list.**

- 8) **Ear-Marking:** Reserved category candidate entitled to admission on the basis of merit in an open category seat will have the option of taking admission either against his/her respective category seat or on an open category seat. If he/she opts for the reserved category, he/she will be deemed to have been admitted as an open category candidate and not as reserved category candidate. One seat in the college where he/she was eligible for admission against open seat shall be earmarked for a candidate belonging to the respective reserved category. Such earmarked seat will be made available immediately to the successive reserved category candidate from the same category merit.

Admission under constitutional reservation seat will be governed by the Maharashtra Schedule Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Denotified Tribes (VimuktaJatis), Nomadic Tribes, Other Backward Classes and Special Backward Category Regulation of Issuance and Verification of Caste Certificate Act, 2000 (Mah. Act No. XXIII of 2001).

14. "Eligible" means a condition where a respondent is any of the following conditions, after being notified—

- (i) Total duration of flight is 10
  - (ii) Visual acuity less than 20/30 or less than 15/20 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction
  - (iii) Angle of visual field of vision subtending an angle of less than 15 degrees

- (C) Hearing Impairment:-
- (a) "deaf" means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequency in both ears;
  - (b) "hard of hearing" means persons having 40 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
  - (c) "person with hearing impairment" means a person with disability arising out of conductive, sensorineural, mixed or any combination of aural factors affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.
3. "Intellectual disability" means an abnormality documented by significant limitations both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behavior (which covers a range of every day) social and practical skills, regardless:-
- (a) "person with hearing disability" means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and to do the activities which are a part of personal, academic, occupational, vocational, or social functioning; dyslexia, dyscalculia, dysgraphia, dysorthoxia, dyspraxia and developmental dyspraxia;
  - (b) "person with specific disorder" means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate by understanding and using language, and/or frequently associated with motor or other neurotypical clinical conditions.
4. "Mental Retardation" means a substantial decrease of thinking, learning, perception, information or memory that greatly impairs judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognise reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life; but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind, if person, specifically characterised by subnormality or low IQ.
4. Disability caused due to:-
- (a) "cerebral palsy" means congenital condition of brain, most perceptible in infancy, which causes impairment in judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognise reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life; but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind, if person, specifically characterised by subnormality or low IQ.
  - (b) "epilepsy" means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the electric discharges around the areas of cerebral cells of the brain and spinal cord are irregular, causing a disturbance and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other;
  - (c) "Parkinson's disease" means a progressive disease of the nervous system characterised by tremor, muscle rigidity, and slow, impulsive movement, chiefly affecting middle aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.
5. "Blood disorder"
- (a) "haemophilia" means a hereditary disease, mainly affecting only males, characterised by abnormal bleeding in those male children, characterised by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood as their major haematologic manifestation;
  - (b) "thalassaemia" means a group of inherited disorders characterised by reduced or absent synthesis of haemoglobin;
  - (c) "sickle cell disease" means a hereditary disorder characterised by chronic anaemia, painful crises, and various complications due to increased tissue and organ damage; haemolytic crisis is the destruction of the red membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of haemoglobin.
5. Multiple Disabilities means that one of the above specified disabilities including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, learning and functional problems.
6. Any other sub-group may be included by the Central Government.

Note: A person should be fit to undertake the EPMV (short) 100% marks examination for admission in the above mentioned

2. The extent of "Specified Disability" of a person shall be assessed in accordance with the "Guidelines for the purpose of assessing the extent of specified disability in a person included under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016



(29 of NEET-PG) issued on the basis of Order by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment [Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities/Government] dated 16 January, 2022.

3. The minimum degree of disability needed for 40% (Seventy-six Disability) or more to be eligible for reservation for persons with specified disability.

**Following Documents are required to be submitted for admission against NRI Quota**

- 1) Certificate for the students having basic qualification fixed by respective Council/Authority for admission to respective Health Sciences courses, And
- 2) NRI certificate of the students OR of his/her mother or father OR the real brother or the real sister ordinarily residing abroad, OR
- 3) NRI Certificate of following persons having blood relation with the student who consider such student as 'ward' (palya) viz, the real brother/sister of father OR the real brother /sister of mother, OR the father /mother of father OR the father/mother of mother OR 1st degree paternal/maternal cousins ordinarily residing abroad and should have looked after the student as guardians with documentary evidence to that effect and also affidavit in support of the aforesaid facts.

**To prove the NRI status of the sponsor, following documents (issued by the competent Authority wherever required) are required to be submitted:**

- 1) Affidavit of claimant/sponsor disclosing his full identity i.e. Full name, Age, Residence, Occupation, Relationship with the candidate, etc duly signed by the sponsor, and

- 3) Residence of NRI, Valid VISA, and
- 4) Proof of residence i.e Driving License, Telephone Bill, Property Tax Copy, IT return copy, etc and
- 5) Proof of residence showing minimum continuous 182 days of stay of claimant NRI in Abroad of Academic Year of admission prior to the admission date, and
- 6) True copy of Foreign Bank Account Passbook (with copies of main page indicating band name & Address Claimants name and address, with entries of last preceding 6 months prior to admission.

**To prove the relationship between sponsor and candidates the candidate should submit following documents (issued by Competent Authority wherever required)**

- 1) Affidavit of claimant disclosing his full identity i.e Full name, Age, Occupation, Relationship with sponsor etc. duly signed by the candidates/students or his/her parents.
- 2) Affidavit of Family chart duly signed by claimant making clear the relationship, and

ORAL ORDER:- (PER GAWAI, J)

Heard, Leave to amend. Amendments be carried out during the course of the day.

2] Rule Rule made returnable forthwith Heard by consent.

3] The petitioner in effect challenges the Government Resolution dated 24th November 2017 and the consequent clauses Nos. 8.13 and 0.17 & of the information brochure published by the respondent No.1 prescribing the admissions for the post of graduate courses for medical colleges under the management of Government





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as well as Corporation.

4] The facts in brief giving rise in the present petitions are thus:-

The petitioners have taken admissions for M.B.B.S. course for the period between 1st November 2011 till 24th November 2017.

5] The State Government has been prescribing various terms and conditions for submitting the bond for the students who have undertaken their studies in the Government/ Corporation colleges and also prescribing the bonds to be forfeited on failure of students in performing their duties in the Government / Corporation hospitals for the bond period.

6] Vide another Government Resolution dated 8th February 2008, the State Government made provisions for making compulsory the conditions of furnishing a bond for the students who had taken admission in the Government and Corporation colleges.

and dental colleges stating that after completion of their M.B.B.S and B.D.S. course, the candidate would be required to render one year service in the Government Corporation / defence service establishments. It will be relevant to refer to clause 1 and clause 3 of the said G.R. The true translated version thereof reads as under:-

\*1.1 Candidates who took degree on studying MBBS or BDS course in government/municipal corporation medical oriental college are required to complete one-year service of government/local body /security force immediately thereon. If candidate denied to carry such government service or avoided for any reason, penalty shall be recovered to extent of Rs.5 lakh (Rupees five lakh only)for student admitted in educational year 2004-05 to 2007-08 and rupees 10 lakh (Rupees ten lakh only) for student admitting from educational year 2008-09.

1.2. Action should be taken as per serial number 6 of the Government Resolution dated 31 July, 2006 mentioned in course of giving such appoint to candidate after completing degree course.

1.3. One-year service condition is exempted as per government resolution dated 31 July, 2006 in the context of candidates joined the post graduate course.

2.1. Students who have obtained post graduate





degree / post graduate diploma taking the education of M.D. / M.S. / Post Graduate Diploma from Government / Municipal Medical and Dental College are required to complete one-year service of government / local body / defense force. If any candidate denies to complete government service or defaults due any reason, the fine will be recorded to extent of Rs.15 lakh (In words Fifteen Lakh) from him.

2.2 List of remaining candidates shall be submitted with director, health services on filling posts vacant at director, medical education to appoint candidate on completing post graduate course.

2.3. 1 year service condition under 2(1) above is exempted for candidate joined super specialty course.

3.1 Candidate who obtained super specialty degree studying super specialty of diploma course in government/municipal medical or dental college is required to do two years' service for government/ local body /security force. Rs.25 lakh (Rupees twenty-five lakh only) shall be recovered for penalty from him, if candidate denied to do such government service or if avoided for any reason.

3.2. List of remaining candidates shall be submitted with director, health services on filling vacant post at director, medical education to appoint candidate as mentioned in above 3(1) on completing super specialty diploma/degree course."





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7] A perusal of the said G.R. would thus reveal that if the candidate who has undertaken studies in the medical colleges under the management of State Government or Corporation fails to render service in Government/ Corporation and defence establishments, then, a penalty would be recovered from such candidates who have taken admission for the academic year 2004-05 to 2007-08 at Rs.5 lakhs and Rs.10 lakhs for the candidates who have taken admission for academic years 2008 on wards.

8] Clause 3 thereof reveals that such of the candidates who have taken admission for P.G. course prior to 31<sup>st</sup> July 2006 in their case, the condition of one year's compulsory service shall stand relaxed.

9] Vide another G.R. dated 1<sup>st</sup> November 2011, the State Government again provided for eligibility criteria for entrance examination for P.G. medical seats for 2012. It would be relevant to refer to clauses 1, 2 and 7 of the said notification. They read thus:-





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PG-Medical CET-2022

(1) Candidate will be allowed to appear for PGM-CET only twice – first time for the examination conducted before the date of internship completion and second time for the examination conducted after the completion of mandatory internship period.

(2) Being eligible and allowed for two attempts as above. If candidate does not take admission to a postgraduate course, he or she will have to complete the Bond Service before taking subsequent attempts of PGM-CET.

(3) Candidate will be allowed to appear for PGM-CET only twice – first time for the examination conducted before the date of internship completion and second time for the examination conducted after the completion of mandatory internship period. While counting the attempts whether the candidate actually appeared for the examination or not, will not be taken into consideration.”

10] It could be thus seen that a candidate would be allowed to appear for P.G.Medical CET only twice, first after examination conducted before the date of internship and second time after the completion of mandatory internship period. Clause 2 further provides that after being eligible and allowed for two attempts as provided for in clause 1, if the candidate does not take admission for P.G. course, he or she will have to complete bond service before taking subsequent admission for P.G.Medical CET. It further





provides that the candidate would be allowed to appear for PG Medical CET only twice i.e. for the first time after the examination conducted before the date of Internship and second time after the mandatory period of Internship is over. It further provides that while counting the number of attempts, whether the candidate actually appeared or not will not be taken into consideration.

11] The position continued to exist from 1<sup>st</sup> November 2011 till 12<sup>th</sup> October 2017. Vide G.R. dated 12<sup>th</sup> October 2017, the Government again changed the condition. It will be relevant to refer to Clauses A, B, C and D of the said G.R. A true translation of the same reads as under:-

a). In addition to completing bonded service of government in prescribed period after completing M.B.B.S.Course from Government / Municipal Medical College, such candidates will not able to be decided as eligible for admission of MD / MS / Postgraduate courses.

b). In addition to completing bonded service of government in prescribed period by the candidate who completed post graduate degree / diploma course from Government / Municipal Medical College has not completed, such candidate cannot be decided eligible for admission of Super Specialty Course.





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*For Department of Health*

c] Students completing Super Specialty Course from Government / Municipal College will be bound to complete bonded service of government for 2 years period.

d] The said policy will be applicable since admissions in educational year 2018-19 of medical and dental post graduate and super specialty course. Hence, the aspiring Candidates for admission of post graduate or super specialty courses in 2018-19 will be required to complete government's bonded service before admission only.

12] It could thus be seen that for the first time on 12<sup>th</sup> October 2017, the Government has changed the condition as prescribed in Government Notification dated 1<sup>st</sup> November 2011 provided that unless the candidates who have passed their MBBS from Government/ Corporation colleges, complete their bonded service, they would not be entitled to apply for M.D./ M.S./ M.C. Diploma course. It further provides that insofar as the candidates who have completed their P.G. degree/ diploma from such colleges, they would not be entitled for admission to the super specialty course. It further provides that such of the candidates who complete their super specialty course from the Government and Corporation colleges, they would be required to complete bonded service of two years in the Government institution. Clause D provides that the said





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policy would be applicable for the P.G. as well as Super Speciality courses from the academic years 2018-19.

12] It appears that the students who had passed their examination in the academic year 2018-19, made representation to Government and, therefore, the Government vide notification dated 24<sup>th</sup> November 2017, issued a corrigendum to the G.R. dated 12<sup>th</sup> October 2017. It reads thus:-

"d. The said policy will be applicable since admissions in educational year 2019-20 of medical and dental post graduate and super specialty course. Hence, the aspiring Candidates for admission of post graduate or super specialty courses in 2019-20 will be required to complete government's bonded service before admission only."

13] It would thus be seen that though the change of policy is effected from 12<sup>th</sup> October 2017, the State Government has by its R dated 24<sup>th</sup> January 2017, exempted the students who have been admitted in academic years 2018-19 and made it applicable from the year 2019-20.

14] Subsequently, the Government also issued a brochure





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thereby prescribing the procedure for admission to the P.G. course. It will be relevant to refer to clause A-13. It could thus be seen that the said clause has been inserted in the brochure only in order to give effect to the G.R. dated 17<sup>th</sup> October 2017.

15] In this background, the petitioners have approached this court contending that their admissions for the P.G. course could be governed only by the rules as were existing at the time of their admission for under graduate course. It is submitted that by change of rules in the year 2017, the Government cannot make applicable the change in policy which was in vogue for the students who have taken admission since 2011. The petition is vehemently opposed by Mr. Rajeshirke, learned Counsel who seeks to intervene on behalf of some students who have completed bond and Mr. Kalel and Mrs.Smt. Palsule-Desai, learned AGP for State.

16] It is submitted that the change in policy has been effected since it was found that in the hospitals run by State Government in the rural, tribal and remote areas, qualified Doctors are not available. It is, therefore, submitted that in order to make





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available the services of Doctors, it has been decided that the candidates passing MBBS examination will first have to complete the bonded service of one year and only then he would be made /considered eligible to apply for P.G. course.

17] At the outset, we would like to state that the scope of our interference while exercising the powers under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, is very limited, unless the policy is found to be arbitrary, unreasonable, irrational or made in order to suit a particular class.

18] No doubt that the change in policy made by the State Government of making it compulsory for medical student who has graduated from Government colleges or Corporation Colleges to serve in the Government or Corporation hospitals for a period of one year is a laudable policy. However, in the present matter we are not called upon to consider as to whether the said policy withstands the test of Article 14 of the Constitution or not. The only question that we are called upon to answer is, as to whether the candidate who has taken admission to the MBBS course between 1<sup>st</sup> November





2011 till 12<sup>th</sup> October 2017, can be subjected to a change of policy which has been effected for the first time on 12<sup>th</sup> October 2017.

19] The policy as was in existence on the basis of 2018 circular as well as 2011 notification, prescribed a candidate to furnish a bond of Rs.5 lakhs for the students who has taken admission between 2004-05 and 2007-08 and a bond of Rs.10 lakhs for students who have taken admission after 2008-9 till 2017-18. The clause further provides that provisions of the said G.R. dated 8<sup>th</sup> February 2008 exempted such students who have taken admission for P.G. course prior to 31<sup>st</sup> July 2006. Rightly understanding that even the provisions of the G.R. dated 8<sup>th</sup> February 2010 could not have been made applicable retrospectively, the State Government exempted the class of students who had taken admission for P.G. course. The policy undergone further change by G.R. dated 1<sup>st</sup> November 2011, which provided that a candidate who has passed MBBS or BDS degree from Government/ Corporation Medical colleges, will be entitled to appear for P.G. M. CFT examination only twice. It provided that the first of such attempt would be permitted prior to the completion of Internship and second such attempt would





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be permitted immediately after completion of mandatory internship period. It further provides that if a candidate is eligible and allowed for two attempts and does not take admission to P.G. course, he /she will have to complete bond service before taken subsequent attempt at P.G.M.C.E.T. Clause 7 provides that the Candidates will be allowed to appear for C.E.T. only twice. It further provides that if whilst counting number of attempts whether the candidate actually appeared for examination or not will not be taken into consideration.

20] It would thus be seen that the effect of conjoined reading of various clauses in 2011 notification is very clear. The candidate who passed his MBBS/ BDS degree from a Government/ Corporation medical college would be entitled to two chances for appearing for the PGME CET. First chance would be during internship period and second chance would be immediately after completion of internship period. It is further provided that if a candidate who, after completion of internship period, is entitled to appear for the first examination conducted thereafter, but for some reason choose not to appear, then, such non appearance will also be taken into account as exhausted chance. For example if a





candidate completes his internship period in December 2016 and immediate examination is available in March 2017 but if he chooses not to appear for the said exam, then, the second chance will be deemed to be exhausted and he will have no other alternative but to complete bond service before he again becomes entitled to participate in PG-M CET.

21] The policy which was in vogue from 1<sup>st</sup> November 2011 has been now sought to be changed for the first time on 12<sup>th</sup> October 2017. By this change in policy it is now made mandatory that a candidate would not be entitled to appear for PG-M CET unless he completes the bonded service. No doubt, that as observed hereinabove, no fault can be found with the policy since it is being effected in order to provide service in the Government- run hospitals in rural and tribal areas. However, the candidates who had taken admission between 1<sup>st</sup> November 2011 to 12<sup>th</sup> October 2017, will have to be governed by the policy which was in existence during that period. The candidates have taken admission during this period on the basis that their admission for P.G. course would be governed by 2011 notification. It will be relevant to refer to the judgement of





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Apex Court in the case of Dr. Dinesh Kumar and Ors. Vs. Motilal Nehru Medical College, Allahabad and Ors., reported in (1985) 3 S.C.C. 22.

22] It could thus be seen that authorities cannot change and apply the Rules retrospectively to the detriment of students who have proceeded to take up their career on the basis of the rules existing on the date of admission. It could thus be seen that though we do not find any reason to interfere with the policy, we are of the considered view that making the policy applicable retrospectively to the students who have taken admission before 12<sup>th</sup> October 2017, would not be sustainable in law. It could further be seen that the Government itself realising that such a change would not be possible to applicable retrospectively has issued a corrigendum on 27<sup>th</sup> November 2017 making the change applicable from academic year 2018-20. Apart from that it is to be noted that such of the candidates who would be entitled to be admitted for P.G. course from Government/ Corporation colleges would also be required to furnish bond for rendering service in Government hospitals. Even in the understanding of petitioners, after completion of their super





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specialty course they will be required to complete three years service in the Government colleges i.e. one year towards their bond for the under graduate course and one year for their admission to the P.G. course and one year for super specialty course. Even insofar as candidates who have been admitted between November 2011 to 12<sup>th</sup> October 2017, even if they undertake their P.G. studies in the Government colleges, they will be required to render two years Government service one year on account of bond for P.G. course and one year on account for under graduate course.

23] In that view of the matter, we find that the petitions deserve to be allowed. We, therefore, hold and declare that the G.R. dated 12<sup>th</sup> October 2017 and consequent rules i.e. 8.13 and 8.17.8 which require the candidate who has taken admission between 1<sup>st</sup> November 2011 and 12<sup>th</sup> October 2017 to compulsorily discharge bond for a period of one year, would not be applicable to such of the students who have taken admission for P.G. course between 1<sup>st</sup> November 2011 till 12<sup>th</sup> October 2017. We clarify such condition would be applicable to all such candidates who have taken admission for their undergraduate course after 12<sup>th</sup> October 2017.





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24] Needless to state that the civil application stands disposed of in view of disposal of these petitions.

#### NOTIFICATION

Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Education Institutions (Regulation of Admissions to the Full Time Professional Post Graduate Medical and Dental Courses) Rules, 2017

No. 304102/2017/1001-2.- In exercise of the powers conferred by section 28 of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. Act XXVIII of 2015), and in pursuance of the Government Resolution, Medical Education and Drugs Department, No. 304102/2017/1001, dated the 18th April 2018, the Government of Maharashtra hereby makes the following rules to regulate the admissions to the First Year of the Full Time Professional Medical Post Graduate Courses and Dental Post Graduate Courses in the Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions in the State of Maharashtra, namely:

1. Short title and commencement.—(1) These rules may be called the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission to the Full Time Professional Post Graduate Medical and Dental Courses) Rules, 2017.

(2) They shall come into force with effect from the date they are published in the Maharashtra Government Gazette.

2. Definitions.—(1) In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—

(a) "Act" means the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. Act XXVIII of 2015);

(b) "Admission Reporting Institution" means the institution where the Candidates shall report to confirm the admission by submitting required documents and payment of prescribed fees;



(e) "Application Form" means the prescribed form to be filled up, online or offline, by the candidate for admission to the Courses as defined in clause (f);

(f) "CAP Form" means the form to be filled in through the Centralized Admission Process (CAP) notified and by the Competent Authority;

(g) "the Common Entrance Test (CET)", for the purposes of the Courses, means the "National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET-UG)" or "National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET-MDS)", as applicable to the respective Course;

(h) "the Courses" means the Post Graduate Medical Courses or Postgraduate Dental Courses, as the case may be, conducted in the State of Maharashtra as per the approval of the MCC or the DCI;

(i) "the DCC" means the Dental Council of India constituted under the Dentists Act, 1948 (10 of 1948);

(j) "the TCI regulations" means the regulations of the Dental Council of India made for the purposes of the Post Graduate Dental Courses;

(k) "Documents Verification Centre" means the city or town where the documents verification is to be conducted;

(l) "Eligible Candidates" means the candidates who are eligible for admission to different professional Post Graduate Medical and Dental Courses as notified by the Government, from time to time, under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Act;

(m) "Internship" means the compulsory rotating internship to be completed as per rules or regulations of the Medical Council of India (MCI) or the Dental Council of India (DCI) and the Maharashtra Medical Council (MHMC) or the Maharashtra State Dental Council (MSDC) and the concerned University, as the case may be;

(n) "Order-of-Merit" means the order of merit in respect of various classes, category and reservation types of the Candidates determined by following the NEET-PG or NEET-MDS merit in accordance with these rules;

(o) "Traditional Quota" means the seats available for admission to eligible Candidates at Universities level as declared by the State Government or the appropriate authority, from time to time;

(p) "the MCC" means the Medical Council of India constituted under the Indian Medical Councils Act, 1956 (100 of 1956);

(q) "MCI regulations" means the regulations of Medical Council of India made for the purposes of Post Graduate Medical Courses;

(r) "Minority Quota" means the seats earmarked for the Minority Community students from within the State, belonging to the Minority Community to which the institution belongs;

(s) "the MHHS" means the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences established under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Act, 1993 (Mah.X of 1993);

(t) "National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET-UG)" or "NEET-PG" AND "National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET-MDS)" or "NEET-MDS" means the eligibility-cum-entrance examination prescribed as the single central entrance examination conducted by the National Board of Examinations under section 11D of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (100 of 1956) or section 21A of the Dentists Act, 1948 (10 of 1948), for the purpose of admissions respectively to MBBS or BDS or Post Graduate Medical Courses or Post Graduate Diploma Professional Educational Courses;

(u) "Qualifying Examination" means examinations on the basis of which a candidate becomes eligible for admission or its equivalent examinations thereto;



(c) "Registration" means the registration of the qualification either with the MCI or the DCI or the Maharashtra Medical Council (MMC) or the Maharashtra State Dental Council (MSDC), as the case may be, after completing 1 year compulsory rotating internship.

(d) Words and expressions used in these rules but not defined hereinabove shall have the same meanings as respectively assigned to them in the Act.

3. **Submission of Application Form.**—The Competent Authority shall invite Online or Offline Applications in the form provided by it, from the NEET PG or NEET MDS eligible candidates for participating in Centralized Admission Process (CAP) for seeking admission in the Courses.

4. **Declaration of Medium, pattern, Syllabus, Schedule, etc.**—The Medium, pattern, Syllabus, Schedule for admission on the basis of NEET PG or NEET MDS shall be as per the directions or notifications issued or published, from time to time, by the MCI, the DCI or, the National Board of Examination (NBE), as the case may be.

5. **Classification Types.**—(i) **Maharashtra State Candidates.**

Type	Eligibility Criterion
A	All candidates, who have earned final M.B.B.S. or B.D.S. qualifications from a recognized Medical or Dental college included in the Schedule appended to the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (113 of 1956) or from the Schedule appended to the Dentists Act, 1948 (14 of 1948) and situated in Maharashtra are eligible. The Medical or Dental College should have been affiliated to Non-Agricultural Universities constituted under Maharashtra Universities Act, 1994 (Muz. XXXV of 1994) or the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Act, 1996 (Muz. X of 1996) or the Medical College affiliated to the Central university, as per the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956) situated in the State of Maharashtra and completed or completing one year internship training before the 31st March of the academic year for which the admission is to be given as per the NEET-PG or NEET-MDS examinations except those BMS Graduates who have been exempted by the DCI from doing or completing the required internship. The candidate who has obtained registration either from the MCI or the DCI or respective State Council shall be eligible for admission to Post Graduate Medical Courses and Post Graduate Dental Courses, subject to the Merit of the NEET-PG or NEET-MDS Marks at Percentile.
B	A candidate who does not fall in Type A, but who are domiciled in the State of Maharashtra and who have obtained admission under 15% quota for the All India Post Graduate Entrance Examination (AIPGE) for M.B.B.S. or B.D.S. Courses in the medical or dental college situated outside Maharashtra State and who have obtained the degree from a University situated outside the State of Maharashtra and completed or completing one year internship training before the 31st March of the academic year for which the admission is to be given as per the NEET PG or NEET-MDS examinations except those BMS Graduates who have been exempted by the DCI from doing or completing the required internship. The candidate who has obtained registration either from the MCI or the DCI or respective State Council shall be eligible for admission to Post Graduate Medical Courses and Post Graduate Dental Courses, subject to the Merit of the NEET-PG or NEET-MDS Marks at percentile.

(ii) **Minority Candidates.**—The Maharashtra domiciled Candidate belonging to a particular linguistic or religious minority community from within the State fulfilling eligibility criteria as per rule (1) shall be eligible under this Category.

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(2) **NRI Candidates.**—The candidate who fulfils the condition as defined in clause (vi) of section 5 of the Act shall be eligible under this category.

6. **Sanctioned Intake Seats for various Courses.**—The Sanctioned Intake for the First Year of the Courses shall be as per the approval given by the appropriate authority which is competent for giving approval to respective Courses and affiliation given by the respective affiliating University.

7. **Allocation of Seats.**—The percentage of allocation of seats for various types of candidates through Centralized Admission Process (CAP) based on the merit of NEET-PG or NEET-MDS for the First Year of the Courses shall be as per the NCT regulations or the DCT regulations, as specified in the SCHEDULE and in accordance with the policy of the Government for the First Year of Post Graduate Medical and Post Graduate Dental Courses.

(1) **Maharashtra State Candidates Seats.**—The Candidates having Maharashtra State Candidature as specified in sub-rule (1) and (2) of rule 5, shall be eligible for these seats.

(2) **Minority Quota Seats.**—The Candidates having Candidature mentioned in sub-rule (3) of rule 5 shall be eligible for these seats as specified in the SCHEDULE. These seats shall be filled in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 5, of the Act.

(3) **Institutional Quota Seats.**—The Institutions can select Eligible Candidates of as much percentage of the Sanctioned Intake as mentioned in the SCHEDULE, subject to the following conditions, namely:—

(i) The Candidates having Candidature mentioned in sub-rules (1), (2) and (3) of rule 5 shall be eligible for these seats, if applicable;

(ii) The maximum 15% seats may be filled in from the NRI Candidates at the Institutional level, subject to the approval by Admissions Regulating Authority;

(iii) If the seats reserved for the NRI quota remain vacant, these vacant seats may be filled in by the Institution, from the Eligible Maharashtra State Candidates as given in sub-rules (1) and (2) of rule 5 on the basis of rank-merit of NEET-PG examination or NEET-NDS examination.

8. **Preparation of Merit List.** (i) **Assignment of merit number.**—The Competent Authority shall prepare a Provisional State merit list from the eligible candidates who have applied to the Competent Authority, online or offline, in the prescribed form for admission to Post Graduate Medical Courses and Post Graduate Dental Courses on the basis of the marks at percentile in the NEET-PG examination or NEET-MDS examination. The final State merit list shall be generated only after completing procedure of required Therapeutic verifications.

(ii) **Method of calculating marks at qualifying examination for deciding eligibility.**—While deciding the eligibility of the Candidates following procedure shall be adopted,—

(a) To be eligible for admission to the Courses as decided by the NCT or DCT Regulations, a candidate belonging to the General category must obtain minimum of marks at 50 Percentile and candidate belonging to Constitutional Reservation category must obtain minimum of marks at 40 Percentile in NEET-PG or NEET-MDS, as the case may be.

(b) **Assignment of Merit Number for various Courses.**—

(i) **For admission to First Year Postgraduate Medical Courses.**—The merit list for the Candidates shall be prepared on the basis of marks at percentile scored by the Candidates in the NEET-PG conducted by the National Board of Examination (NBE) for the purpose of admission to the First Graduate Medical Courses for the given academic year:

Provided that, in case of the two or more candidates obtaining equal marks at percentile in the NEET-PG examination, their order of merit shall be determined according to the age, the older will get preference over younger.



(c) *For admission to First Year Post Graduate Dental Courses.*— The merit list for the Candidates shall be prepared on the basis of marks at percentage secured by the Candidate in the NEET-PG for the purpose of admission to the Post Graduate Dental Courses for the given academic year.

Provided that, in case of the two or more candidates obtaining equal marks at percentage in the NEET-PG examination, their Junior-seniority shall be determined according to the age, the older will get preference over younger.

(d) *Merit list for admitting NEI seats.*— The merit list for the NEI Candidates stated at sub-rule (b) of rule 7 shall be prepared on the basis of the marks obtained at Common Entrance Test in descending order of merit.

9. *Centralized Admission Process (CAP).*— (1) The Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution shall admit Candidates through the Centralized Admission Process (CAP) as ordered in sub-rule (3) of section 3 of the Act. The stages of CAP shall be as stated below:—

(a) Display or Publishing of college name, subject name and category name distribution of seats or vacancies;

(b) Display or Publishing of Time Schedule and Venue for preference form filling process on website;

(c) Display or Publishing, Details of Preference Form filling and uploading process for admission to Courses;

(d) Verification of documents and endorsement of eligibility of the successful candidates for the admission process at the document verification centres i.e. Marshal, Panna, Amrohtal and Nager followed by filling up of Preference Form by the eligible candidates;

(e) Display or Publishing of allotment of seats for Round-I of CAP by way of computerized process and joining of the candidates at respective institution, as per the allotment within stipulated time;

(f) Display or Publishing of subsequent computerized round(s) of seats remain vacant after completion of CAP Round-I;

(3) Candidate shall be given a chance to retain a seat that has been allotted, by way of status retention form at the end of each CAP round. If a Candidate accepts the offered seat and they do not want to participate in any further rounds of seat allocation, such Candidates shall not be considered in subsequent rounds of admission.

10. *CAP Seat allotment stages and process of allotment.*—Allotment of seats under CAP shall be made in the following manner:

(1) *Majoritative State Candidates.*— The stages of computerized allotments are as follows:

*Stage-I : For all the Candidates.—*

(a) All the Candidates belonging to various categories shall be considered for allotment of seats as per their Junior-seniority.

(b) The Minority category candidate shall be considered for allotment in Open Category seats by virtue of their Junior-seniority and in Minority Quota seats by virtue of merit in their respective minority community to which the institution belongs.

(c) Backward Class Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category seat by virtue of their Junior-seniority or in their respective Category of reservation, if Open Category seats are not available at their merit.

(d) SSC Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category seat by virtue of their Junior-seniority or in OBC Category of reservation, if Open Category seats are not available at their merit.



**Stage-II :** For respective groups of Backward Class Category Candidates.—Inter-se-Merit amongst the reserved categories shall be operated at the end of each round, if necessary against the unfilled reserved category seats as per merit and choice of the reserved categories candidates. The unfilled remaining vacant from various categories shall be filled in during Inter-se-Merit admission process as follows,—

From among the candidates of their respective group from the Inter-se-Merit list of that particular group, where the reservation exist. The groups may be as follows and may be modified by the authority granting the admission as per the policy of reservation of the State Government, working at the time of admission.

#### **GROUP – I**

- (i) Scheduled Caste and Schedule Caste connected to Buddhism (SCB)
- (ii) Scheduled Tribes including those living outside specified area (ST)

#### **GROUP – II**

- (i) Nomadic Jats (NT) (A)
- (ii) Nomadic Tribes (NTCB)

#### **GROUP – III**

- (i) Nomadic Tribes (NTCB)
- (ii) Nomadic Tribes (NTCB)
- (iii) Other Backward Classes (OBC) including EBC

**Stage-III :** For all Backward Class Category Candidates.— If the most reserved for group of Backward Class Category Candidate remains vacant, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidate of Inter-se-merit of all Backward Class Category candidates taken together.

**Stage-IV :** If the seat reserved for Backward Class Category Candidate remains vacant such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidate of General Inter-se-merit (O) for Minority Candidates.—The stages of computerized allotments are as follows :—

(a) The Minority category candidates shall be considered for allotment in Quota category seats by virtue of their inter-se-merit and in Minority Quota seats by virtue of merit in their respective minority community to which the institution belongs.

(b) For minority seats, inter-se-merit will be operated at the end of each round if necessary, against the unfilled minority category seats as per merit.

**11. Allotment of seat by CAP Computerized and CAP personal Round :—**All the CAP Rounds shall be conducted by computerized allotment.

(a) If the seat remains vacant due to non-allotment and non-reporting for admission, or any other reason, such seat shall be considered for allotment in subsequent round.

(b) Final personal counselling round shall be conducted for the unfilled seats. The preference filled by the candidates shall be null and void for this personal counselling round.

All those candidates shall not be eligible for this personal counselling round,—

- (i) who have not filled preference form ; or
- (ii) in which a seat has been allotted in computerized CAP round(s) and not joined ; or
- (iii) who have filled status retention form ; or
- (iv) who have been allotted a seat through All India PG quota in Medicals and joined the college and not surrendered the seat before a prescribed date.



12. *General provisions.*—(a) Allotment of the subsequent computerised round(s) shall be on the basis of merit preference submitted by the candidate during preference form filling process.

(b) All the candidates who have filled a preference form and a seat has not been allotted shall be eligible for the subsequent computerised round(s).

(c) All the candidates who have filled a preference form and a seat has been allotted and joined the Course and not filled the status retention form shall be eligible for the subsequent computerised round(s).

(d) All the candidates who have filled a preference form and a seat has been allotted and joined the Course and filled the Status retention form shall not be eligible for the subsequent computerised round(s).

(e) The allotment list displayed on website shall show the allotment offered to the Candidates. No personal communication or allotment letters in that regard shall be issued to the Candidates.

(f) All the candidates to whom a seat has been allotted on the basis of Merit-cum-preference shall have to compulsorily join the college and Course as allotted, within prescribed period by completing the requisite formalities of submitting all relevant original documents and paying prescribed fees to the concerned institution. In case he or she does not join the Course he or she shall not be eligible for subsequent admission process.

(g) Failure to report in person for seat acceptance shall be considered as if the candidate has rejected the offer.

(h) Allotted Seat shall be cancelled if, at any time, any of the documents or certificates is found to be invalid or fraudulent and/or the Candidate does not meet the eligibility norms.

13. *Admissions to Institutional Quota.*—The Director or Principal of the institution shall carry out the admissions for these seats in the following manner:—

(a) Admissions shall be made in a transparent manner and strictly as per the *Form- as- filled* of the candidate who have applied to the institution.

(b) Information brochure or prospectus of the Institution which specifies rules of admission should be published well before the commencement of the process of admission. All the information in the brochure should also be displayed on the Institution's website.

(c) Institution shall invite applications by notifying schedule of admission and the number of seats in each Course to be filled by the institution, by advertisement in at least two leading newspapers and on the website of the institution.

(d) Regarding Candidates fulfilling the eligibility criteria as notified by the Government and specified by the appropriate authority, from time to time, shall apply to the Principal or Director of the respective institution for admission at the Institution level.

(e) The institution may give admission to the applicants on the basis of their *Form- as- filled* derived from the Merit list declared by the Competent Authority for filling the seats in the Institutional Quota :

Provided that, where the appropriate authority specifies that such admissions shall be based on the basis of NEET-PG or NEET-MDS, in that case the Institutional quota shall be filled on the basis of *Form- as- filled*.

(f) The institution shall prepare and display the *Form-as-Filled* lists of the Candidates to be filled in at the institution level, in the Institutional Quota and shall publish the same on the website of the institution.

(g) The Minority or Non-Minority institution intending to surrender the Institutional Quota (in part or full) of specified Courses to the C&P shall communicate at least one week before the display of seat matrix of each C&P Round and the same shall be allotted as per the rules of C&P.



(A) All the admissions and cancellations shall be communicated to the Competent Authority within the prescribed period given by the Competent Authority, from time to time.

(B) If any CAP seat remains or becomes vacant after the CAP Round, then the same shall be filled up by the Candidates from the same Category for which it was vacated during the CAP. Further if the seats remain vacant then the seats shall be filled on the basis of *Inter-M-Med* of the applicant.

14. *Institution Level Round for vacant seats after CAP round*—If the seats remain vacant after all CAP Rounds, the said seats shall be filled up by the institutions through Institution Level Round with the prior approval of the Competent Authority. The institute shall receive applications from the eligible candidates who are declared eligible in the NEET-PG or NEET-MDS, as the case may be. The admission shall be granted by the institution strictly on the basis of *Inter-M-Med* of the NEET-PG or NEET-MDS, as the case may be.

15. *Approval of Merit List and the Admitted Candidates List*—(A) After completion of Admission process, every Recognised Private Professional Educational Institution shall submit the Admission-approved proposal to the Admissions Regulating Authority in accordance with the instruction (c) of the section 14 of the Act.

(B) The Admission-approved proposal shall include the list of all Candidates admitted which shall have the name, Candidates type, nationality, Qualification Mark, etc., as well as the required documents of the Candidates admitted at institution level.

16. *Refund of fee after cancellation of admission by institutions*—(A) Refund of fee by the college after change of college, Course or cancellation of admission:

(1) On or before such date as may be declared by the competent authority

Rs. 5000 (Rs. One Thousand Five Hundred only) to be deducted and rest of the fee which is entitled to be refunded to the candidate shall be refunded immediately.

(2) After such date as may be declared by the competent authority— No refund

(B) If a candidate expires or becomes unfit to undergo the Course as per MCI norms or DCI norms and decided by notified Medical Board within 3 months from the date of admission, full refund of fee as paid shall be made.

17. *Change of Course or Institution*—After Cut off date of admission as notified under the MCI regulations or the DCI regulations, change of Course or Institution shall not be permitted.

18. *Cheating and Dishonesty*—(a) Failure of the candidate in making full and correct statement in the application form and/or suppression of any information, would lead to disqualification of the candidate, even at later date. Such a candidate shall be debarred from the entire selection process.

(b) It is responsibility of every candidate to submit proper documents. Any attempt to submit documents which are not genuine shall lead to cancellation of the admission of the candidate, forfeiture of the fees, deposits and expulsion of the candidate from the college by the Competent Authority or by its authorised official. The name of such candidate's shall be deleted from the State Merit List and he/she shall not be eligible for further rounds of the selection process and shall be debarred from the selection process.

(c) If any candidate or Authorised representative or person accompanying is found obstructing the conducting and/or admission process, or trying to influence in unlawful manner or creating nuisance, the candidate shall be liable for disqualification from the process of selection and appropriate legal action shall be taken. The decision taken by the Competent Authority in this respect shall be final and binding.



(2) The Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik shall take the decision regarding eligibility, enrolment and registration and granting of the term of selected candidates. The selection of a candidate by the Competent Authority at a later date does not place any onus to accord approval for grant of term.

(3) Concerning directly or indirectly for the allotment of seat would disqualify the candidate for admission. Influencing the staff by any other means, shall lead to cancellation of allotted seat and such candidate shall also face disqualification for participation at the subsequent Postgraduate Medical or Dental Admission Process.

(4) In case of dispute in the matter of allotment of seat, Course, institutions or any other matter pertaining to the provisional selection or cancellation of admission, the decision of the Competent Authority shall be final and binding.

Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Fees) Act, 2015.

No.CST-3517/164/Part-1/17/Education-S.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 23 of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Fees) Act, 2015 (Chh. XXVIII of 2015) the Government of Maharashtra hereby makes the following rules further to amend the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission to the Full Time Professional Post Graduate Medical and Dental Courses) Rules, 2015, namely:—

1. Short title.—These rules may be called the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission to the Full Time Professional Post Graduate Medical and Dental Courses) (Amendment) Rules, 2015.

2. In rule 5 of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission to the Full Time Professional Post Graduate Medical and Dental Courses) Rules, 2015 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Rules"), for sub-rule (1), the following shall be substituted, namely:—

(1) Maharashtra State Candidates.— (A) The candidates fulfilling following eligibility criteria shall be eligible for admission under this candidature:—

Eligibility Criteria:—

(a) The Candidate must be an Indian National



(vi) The candidate shall be a domicile of State of Maharashtra.

(vii) The candidate must be medically fit.

(viii) All candidates, who have passed final Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (M.B.B.S.) or Bachelor of Dental Surgery (B.D.S.) examination and completed or completing one year internship training by 1<sup>st</sup> March of the year in which NEET PG or NEET MDS is held, from a recognised Medical or Dental college included in the Schedule appended to the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (112 of 1956) or the Schedule appended to the Dentists Act, 1948 (18 of 1948) and situated in the State of Maharashtra are eligible. The candidates who have obtained registration either from the MCI or the DCI or respective State Council shall be eligible for admission to the Courses, subject to fulfilling the eligibility criteria of the NEET PG or NEET MDS Maharashtra.

Provided that, the candidates who are domiciled in the State of Maharashtra and—

(a) who have obtained admission under 15% All India quota for Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (M.B.B.S.) or Bachelor of Dental Surgery (B.D.S.) course in the medical or dental college situated outside State of Maharashtra and who have obtained a degree from a University situated outside the State of Maharashtra; or

(b) who have obtained admission for Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (M.B.B.S.) course in the Medical college of All India Institutes of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) or Central Government Institutions, shall also be eligible for admission to the courses subject to the merit of the NEET PG or the NEET MDS marks ( percentile, as the case may be.

(iii) Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) or Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) and Non-Resident Indians (NRI) shall not be eligible under this candidature.

1. For rule 11 of the principal Rules, the following shall be substituted, namely:—

11. **Allocation of seats by CAP computerised mode**—

(a) All the CAP Rounds shall be conducted by computerised allotment.

(b) The selection of the candidates shall be made on the basis of online preferences given by the candidates. Seats allocation shall be made centrally at the later date on the basis of NEET Merit list, eligibility and preferences submitted by the candidate.

(c) The preference form shall be available online on the website as notified by the Competent Authority. The candidate shall submit only one duly filled online preference form. The preferences once submitted cannot be changed.

(d) There shall be one or more rounds of selection of candidates depending on the availability of vacant seats. For actual or subsequent rounds an separate preference form shall be filled in by the candidate. The choices of courses and colleges once submitted online by the candidate shall be final and irrevocable. This final date shall be used in entire selection process for the admission to first year post graduate courses for the same academic year only.

(e) Using NEET PG or NEET MDS Merit list, a list of candidates eligible for admission in the State shall be prepared. This list shall be operated from number one onwards in each round of selection. The candidate getting selected in previous round shall be considered for betterment during subsequent rounds. The betterment begins when the higher preferences exercised by the candidate. The shift in such betterment shall be mandatory except for those who have filed "Status Retention Form". Such a candidate who has filed Status Retention Form will not be considered for any subsequent rounds of selection process for the same academic year. The last date of filling Status Retention Form shall be notified along with the selection list of each Centralized Admission Process (CAP) round.

(f) Based on preferences given, the seat shall be allotted on merit and the allotment shall be displayed on the website of the Competent Authority.



(g) **Demarcating of reserved category candidates.**—Reserved category candidates entitled to admission on the basis of merit in an open category seat shall have the option of taking admission either against his respective category seat or an open category seat. If he opts for the reserved category seats, then he shall be deemed to have been admitted as an open category candidate and not as a reserved category candidate. One seat in the college where he was eligible for admission against open seat shall be earmarked for a candidate belonging to the respective reserved category. Such earmarked seat shall be made available immediately to the respective reserved category candidate from the same category merit during the counselling.

(A) The cut off date for the course shall be as specified by the MCI or DCI, from time to time.

(d) If the seat remains vacant due to non-allocation, non-reporting for admission and resigning after joining or any other reason, such a seat shall be considered for admission in subsequent round.

(g) Final CAP round shall be Map Up rounds, conducted for the unfilled seats. Following candidates shall not be eligible for such rounds:

(a) candidate to whom a seat has been allotted in computerised CAP rounds and not joined; or

(b) candidate who has filled status selection form.”

4. In rule 12 of the principal Rules, after clause (d), the following clause shall be inserted, namely:—

“(d) 3) For subsequent rounds those candidates who are joined and resigned after allotment of seats or joined but not working in the institution shall not be considered eligible for further selection process.”

5. For rule 13 of the principal Rules, the following shall be substituted, namely:—

“(13). **Admission to institutional quota.**—The admission to the seats under institutional quota shall be made as per the directions of MCI or DCI, as the case may be, and the Central Government issued from time to time.”

6. For rule 14 of the principal Rules, the following shall be substituted, namely:—

“(14). **Institution Level Round for vacant seats after CAP Map Up Rounds.**— If the seats remain vacant after all CAP Map Up rounds, the said seats shall be filled in by the Institution through Institution Level Round with the prior approval of the Competent Authority. The Dean or Principal of the institution shall carry out the admissions for these vacant seats on the basis of merit/merit of the NEET PG or NEET MDG, as the case may be, as per the directions issued by the Competent Authority during that academic year.”

1) Rule. Rule is made returnable forthwith. Respondents were served. Heard by consent of parties.

2) Petitioners are challenging condition No(10) in the eligibility criteria prescribed in the Notification dated 30/01/2018, issued by the State Government for admission to the post-graduate courses in Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions in the State of

Maharashtra and condition No.1.3 in the eligibility criteria prescribed in the Notification dated 29/01/2018 issued by the State Government for admission to the Government/Municipal Corporations and notified medical/dental Colleges for post-graduate courses. The condition, badly under challenge, reads thus:-

“(3) The candidate shall be a domicile of State of Maharashtra.”

3] Mr. Thorat, learned Counsel appearing on behalf of the Petitioners, submits that the condition, as imposed by the State Government, is contrary to the various Judgments of the Supreme Court, beginning from the case of *Pradeep Jain vs. Union of India & Ors.*<sup>1</sup>, which has been consistently followed till the judgment of the Supreme Court in the case of *Vishal Goyal vs. State of Karnataka*<sup>2</sup>.

4] He further submits that, not only this but a similar condition which was imposed by the State Government for the academic year 2017-18 was struck by Division Bench of this Court by Order dated 30/04/2017 passed in Writ Petition No.5383 of 2017. He submits

that, the SLP filed by the State Government, challenging the same, was not passed by the State Government. Learned Counsel therefore submits that, the impugned condition need to be quashed and set aside.

51. Mr. Kumbhakar, learned Advocate General has vehemently opposed the prayer made by the Petitioner. He submits that, out of 1429 seats for post graduate courses and 249 seats for diploma courses, 50% of the seats are required to be filled-in under the All India Quota. He therefore submits that, when remains is only remaining 50% quota. He further submits that, if in the said 50% quota, the students who are not originally belonging to State of Maharashtra but coming from other States, are permitted to compete with the students from State of Maharashtra, situation would lead to totally unfair treatment being given to students who are originally belonging to State of Maharashtra. Learned Advocate General further submits that, when the State of Maharashtra incurs huge expenditure on providing educational facilities to the students for the post graduate courses, it is a reasonable expectation that the expenditure so incurred by it should be utilized for providing facilities to the

students in the State of Maharashtra. He, however, submits that students, who are admitted against the All India Quota for MBBS Course, complete their post-graduation in the State of Maharashtra and after completing it, stay elsewhere and therefore, huge expenditure incurred by the State on providing facilities to such students goes in waste insofar as State of Maharashtra is concerned. Learned Advocate General therefore submits that, the students who are originally from the State of Maharashtra have legitimate claim that atleast 50% of the total seats in the Government/Corporation, Government aided Colleges should be made available to the students who are originally from the State of Maharashtra.

6) Mr. Dadi, learned Counsel appearing on behalf of the intervention, supports the submissions made by the learned Advocate General. He also submits that, the Rule which is enacted in order to safeguard the interest of the students who are MBBS graduates, seeking admission to post-graduate course and domiciled in the State Maharashtra, needs to be upheld.

7) At the first blush, arguments of learned Advocate General may

appear to be quite attractive. However, in view of the settled legal position, as has been laid down by various judgments of the Supreme Court, it will not be even permissible for us to consider the submissions made by learned Advocate General. The Bench consisting of three Hon'ble Judges of the Supreme Court in the case of *Pradeep Jain (dead supra)*, has observed in para 22 that:

"22.....We are therefore of the view that as far as admissions to post-graduate courses, such as MB, MD and the like are concerned, it would be amply desirable not to provide for any reservation based on residence requirement within the State or on institutional preference. But, having regard to broader considerations of equality of opportunity and institutional continuity in education which has its own importance and value, we would direct that though residence requirement within the State shall not be a ground for reservation in admissions to post-graduate courses, a certain percentage of seats may in the proper circumstances, be reserved on the basis of institutional preference in the sense that student who has passed MBBS course from a medical college or university, may be given preference for admission to the post-graduate course in the same medical college or university for such reservation on the basis of institutional preference should not in any case exceed 50 per cent of the total number of open seats available for admission to the post-graduate course....."

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The said position has been consistently followed in various judgments. Reference to all these Judgments, in our view, is not necessary. Lastly in the case of *Vishal Deyal* (cited supra), the condition as imposed by the State of Karnataka while providing institutional preference, also provided that, such students seeking admission in a seat reserved for institutional preference, must, also have origin in the State of Karnataka. While holding that such a condition was not permissible, the Apex Court observed that :-

"11. Mr. Manjuprasad is right that in *Saurabh Chaudhary v. Union of India* [(2003) 77 SCC 146] this Court has held that institutional preference can be given by a State, but in the aforesaid decision of *Saurabh Chaudhary* [(2003) 77 SCC 146], it has also been held that decision of the State to give institutional preference can be invalidated by the court in the event it is shown that the decision of the State is ultra vires the right to equality under Article 14 of the Constitution. When we examine sub-clause (a) of Clause 2.1 of the two Information Bulletins, we find that the expression "A candidate of Karnataka origin" who only is eligible to appear for entrance test has been so defined as to exclude a candidate who has studied MBBS or BDS in an institution in the State of Karnataka but who does not satisfy the other requirements

of sub-clause (a) of Clause 2.1 of the Information Bulletin for PGMT-2014. Thus, the institutional preference sought to be given by sub-clause (a) of Clause 2.1 of the Information Bulletin for PGMT-2014 is clearly contrary to the judgment of this Court in Pradeep Jain case [Pradeep Jain v. Union of India, (1984) 3 SCC 654].”

8] It could thus be seen that, it is a settled position in law that, though it will be permissible to provide reservation on the ground of institutional preference, the condition which requires a candidate who has possessed post-graduate degree also to be domiciled in that State, would not be permissible.

9] In view of the above settled legal position, Petition is allowed and condition No.10 in the eligibility criteria prescribed in the Government Notification dated 30/01/2018 and condition No.1.2 in the eligibility criteria prescribed in the Government Notification dated 29/01/2018 is quashed and set aside.

10] Rule is made absolute in the aforesaid terms.

An affidavit has been filed by Medical Council Committee of Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS), Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and Union of India on 02.12.2021.

It has been stated in the affidavit that DGHS is the designated authority for counselling for 50% All India Quota seats of the contributing States. The designated authority has decided to conduct 4 rounds of All India Quota counselling from the current academic year 2021-2022 for NEET - Under Graduate and Post Graduate as per the modified policy approved by this Court and Government Orders issued from time to time.

The proposed modified scheme of Online 4 rounds of counselling will be in tune with the prevailing norms of counselling (including the fees and security deposit) being followed for central Institutes/Universities. The salient points of the scheme are as follows:

- a) There will be 04 rounds of Online counselling i.e. AIQ Round 1, AIQ Round 2, AIQ Map-up Round and AIQ Stray Vacancy Round.
- b) The seats which were earlier reverted back to



the respective States after the completion of Round 2 of AIQ will continue to be filled in the AIQ Hop-Up Round and AIQ Stray Vacancy Round to be conducted by MCC of India, MoHE in online mode.

c) The said rounds will only be conducted for the AIQ seats having All India character which are contributed by the States for 15% OS seats and 50% PS seats.

d) Fresh registration of candidates will be allowed for:

AIQ Round 1

AIQ Round 2

AIQ Hop-Up Round.

e) There will be no fresh registration for candidates in the AIQ Stray Vacancy Round.

f) There will be an option for up-gradation and free exit, only in Round 1 of the AIQ counselling.

g) There will not be an option of up-gradation to Hop-up round from round 2.

h) Candidates who have joined the allotted seat in Round 2 and further rounds of counselling will not be allowed to resign and will also be ineligible to take part in further rounds of any type of counselling.

i) Candidates who have not joined the allotted seat in round 2 will be eligible for further rounds of counselling subject to forfeiture of security



deposit and fresh registration as only mop-up round.

ii) The provisions with regard to security deposit, option of free seat and eligibility for participation will be as per the Gazette Notification No.MU-34(41)/2010-Med./189435 dated 18/06/2018.”

This court has been informed that the modified schemes shall be implemented for the current year 2021-2022 for admissions to MPPG 10 and PG.

In view of the aforesaid statement made on behalf of MDC, Directorate of Health Services, nothing remains to be adjudicated in the Special Leave Petition and Writ Petition which are disposed of accordingly. Pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of.

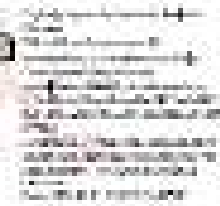

## NOTIFICATION

New Delhi, the 30<sup>th</sup> April, 2022

As MCI/2012/Med/148814, in pursuance of powers conferred by Section 33 of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (195 of 1956), the Medical Council of India with the previous sanction of the Central Government hereby makes the following regulations to amend the "Thangphuan Medical Education Regulations, 2007" namely:

- (i) These regulations may be called the "Thangphuan Medical Education (amendment) Regulations, 2022";
- (ii) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Official Gazette;
2. Clause 4(1), 14(2) (c) under the heading "Starting of postgraduate Medical Courses as follows" and (d) of the "Thangphuan Medical Education Regulations, 2007" shall be substituted as under:-
 

(c) An institution intending to start a postgraduate medical education course in its name shall submit a request to the Central Government through the Director General of Health Services, Government of India, New Delhi, for the prior permission of the Central Government. The Postgraduate Degree/Diploma/Diploma courses shall be for four and three academic years respectively. Provided that it shall be an institution upon Medical College/Medical Institutions to make an application for starting of Post graduate medical education courses within three years of grant of recognition; or, three years from the date of inclusion of the MBBBS qualification awarded by the Medical College in the First Schedule of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956. Failure to make an application for starting of Postgraduate courses within the stipulated time shall entail the withdrawal of recognition of MBBBS qualification.

Provided further that a Medical College/Medical Institutions that makes an application for starting of a Postgraduate course in the territory of Jammu and Kashmir shall be granted such prior permission for the succeeding year to make an application. Failure to obtain permission of the Central Government thereafter shall result in withdrawal of Recognition of MBBBS qualification.

Provided further that clause shall be applicable to the schools established from the academic year 2016-21 onwards, in order to provide time to the existing colleges to comply.

(d) The Institute shall apply for recognition of the Post Graduate Medical qualification to the Central Government through the following Director, who is the designated authority shall be the officer for the institution to be considered for the affiliation University.

In the event of deficiency being found in the institution, the Institution will be granted an opportunity to submit compliance within 30 days from the date of communication of deficiency by the Council. Given an opportunity to comply with the deficiency shall be granted to the Institute only once. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee on finding the compliance satisfactory in all courses, the institution shall be recognised the course. In all other cases the prior permission of the Central Government granted under sub-clause (c) shall be granted to those applicant after three and three years for Postgraduate Degree/Diploma/Diploma courses respectively. Failure to such course recognition shall be made to the Central Government to include the qualifications in the First Schedule of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 only in respect of those institutions of Postgraduate Degree Courses and three courses of Postgraduate Diploma courses.
- (3) Failure to comply strictly to procedure as required in sub-clause 1 shall constitute breach in compliance of condition for the institutions Post Graduate courses.

In the event of failure of the Institute to make application for starting Post Graduate courses, the Council may recommend to the Central Government the suspension of the college, namely which may extend to Report such failure per seat of the postgraduate course, and/or suspension of other postgraduate Medical courses of the Institution, and/or order the Institution from making any application for starting or renewal of such its qualification courses for a limited period, and/or including the institution name in MBBBS.

3. Clause 5.14 under the heading "General" of the "Thangphuan Medical Education Regulations, 2007" shall be substituted as under:-

The Medical Institute recognised under the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 for running postgraduate courses shall be the Government of the Indian Medical Council (Amendment) Act, 1995, the Medical



Colleges recognised for awarding Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS) course and the Medical Institutions established by the Central Government for the purpose of imparting postgraduate medical education shall be eligible for starting a postgraduate medical education course in the following the under-specified manner, also by imparting postgraduate medical education course:

Provided that it shall be permissible for Medical Colleges not yet recognised for the award of MBBS to provide under the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 to supply the starting of a Post graduate medical education course in post-graduate and super-specialty subjects, namely, Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, Pharmacology, Pathology, Microbiology, Forensic Medicine, and Community Medicine in the first Medical course of a Postgraduate medical education course for award of MD/MS course and in the following subjects, namely, Anaesthesiology, Dermatology, Geriatrics and Geriatric General Medicine, Paediatrics, Psychiatry, Radiodiagnosis, Radiology, Oncology, Respiratory Medicine, Otorhinolaryngology, General Surgery, Ophthalmology, Otolaryngology, Urology and Gynaecology, in the first of fourth semester, along with the completion of MBBS for the MBBS course."

6. Section 1: Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2007, in Regulation 3 under the heading: "Procedure for selection of candidates for Postgraduate Courses" shall be substituted as under:

**Provided:**

1. The Parliament of India has enacted the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the Indian Medical Council (Amendment) Act, 2016. The Amendment Act also providing the award of the Medical Councils were notified in the Gazette of India on 1<sup>st</sup> August 2016. The Indian Medical Council (Amendment) Act, 2016 has amended section 13(1) and section 41 (a) of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956. The said provision provides that a course or courses may be conducted at medical institutions established by the medical graduates from any post graduate level by the 'recognised authority'. By virtue of this Amendment the Parliament has provided legal authority to the National Eligibility-Cum-Entrance Test Board for NEET included in the Post-Graduate Medical Education Regulations, 2007 by Amendment notified in the Official Gazette on 27<sup>th</sup> December, 2016, 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2017 and 21<sup>st</sup> October 2017.
  2. Further the provisions relating to NEET were quoted by the Hon'ble Supreme Court with its judgment dated 18<sup>th</sup> July 2019 in Christian Medical College V Union & Ors. (SC No. 89 of 2019) and para 114 (corrected version). However, as a Result Notice prepared by the Medical Council of India and the Union of India, the Hon'ble Supreme Court with its order dated 11<sup>th</sup> April 2019 in Neeraj Kumar (or) Neev, 2019, 2019 of AIR reported in Medical Council of India vs. Christian Medical College V Union & Ors. has revised NEET Regulations. The selection for postgraduate courses for the academic year 2019-20 has continued on the basis of provisions of the Indian Medical Council (Amendment) Act, 2016 and the NEET Regulations revised by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and in the Terms of the Indian Medical Council (Amendment) Act, 2016 the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test for the postgraduate course examinations in all medical disciplines conducted at the post graduate level and shall continue to be the uniform entrance examination in all medical educational institutions at the post graduate level.
  3. **Procedure for selection of candidates for Postgraduate courses shall be as follows:**
    - (i) There shall be a uniform entrance examination in all medical educational institutions in the Postgraduate level, namely, National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test for selection in postgraduate courses in each academic year and shall be conducted under the direct supervision of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India.
    - (ii) The "body and conduct" of conduct the "National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test" shall be the National Board of Examination in any other nomenclature as designated by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India.
    - (iii) In relation to eligible for candidates to Postgraduate Course for an academic year it shall be determined for a candidate to obtain minimum of marks as 50<sup>th</sup> percentile in NE, National Eligibility-Cum-Entrance Test for Postgraduate Courses held for the said academic year. However, in respect of candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, and Other Backward Classes, the minimum marks shall be as 40<sup>th</sup> percentile. In respect of candidates with benchmark disability specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, the minimum marks shall be as 45<sup>th</sup> percentile for General Category and 40<sup>th</sup> percentile for SC & ST. The provision shall be determined on the basis of highest marks secured in the All India Courses notified in National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test for Postgraduate courses.
- Provided where sufficient number of candidates in the respective category fail to secure minimum marks as provided in National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test held for the academic year for selection in Postgraduate Courses, the Central Government in consultation with Medical Council of India may, if it



education leave the minimum marks required for admission to Post Graduate Courses for candidates belonging to respective categories and marks are awarded by the Central Board must shall be applicable for the academic year only.

- (4) The recruitment of seats in Medical Colleges/institutions for respective categories shall be as per specified seats provided in State/Union Territories, for all levels including as well as Postgraduate level but of the eligible candidates shall be provided on the basis of the marks obtained in National Eligibility cum Entrance Test and candidates will be selected on the basis of their ranking from the highest to their rank.

Provided that in determining the merit of candidates who are in receipt of government/provide security benefits or in receipt of grant by the Government/Charitable Institution or in receipt of up to 80% of the marks obtained in each year of course in science and/or diploma degree in Medical science (science degree or 100% of the marks obtained in National Eligibility cum Entrance Test). The reason and/or difficulties or Rural areas shall be considered by State Government or a special category candidate in line.

- (5) All marks of medical candidates, under category shall be added up by persons with final mark distribution in accordance with the provisions of the Right of Private and Public Law, 2014. Based on the merit list of National Eligibility cum Entrance Test rank order in Postgraduate Medical Courses.

In order to eligible for admission in Postgraduate Courses for an academic year, it shall be necessary for a candidate to obtain minimum of marks in 50 percentile in the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test, for Postgraduate courses held for the same academic year. However, in respect of candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, and Other Backward Classes, the minimum marks shall be at 40<sup>th</sup> percentile. In respect of candidates with backward disabilities specified under the Right of Private and Public Law, 2014, the minimum marks shall be at 45<sup>th</sup> percentile for General Category and 40<sup>th</sup> percentile for SC/ST/OBC.

- (6) For candidates who has failed to obtain the minimum eligibility marks as provided in State Chapter (3) above shall be returned to the Postgraduate courses in the next academic year.

- (7) In case Government medical colleges/institutions, 80% (Eighty Percent) of the seats shall be filled by State Government or the Authority appointed by them and the remaining 20% (Twenty Percent) of the seats shall be filled by the Government medical colleges/institutions on the basis of the merit list prepared as per the marks obtained in National Eligibility cum Entrance Test.

- (8) 20% of the seats in Postgraduate Medical Courses shall be reserved for Medical Officers in the Government service, who have served for not less than three years in service and are eligible for admission to Postgraduate courses. After acquiring the Postgraduate Diploma, the Medical Officers shall serve for not more than three years in service and be eligible to be employed in the Government service or in the private sector or in the Government service or in the private sector.

- (9) The Government medical colleges/institutions shall regulate admission process in such a way that teaching, or broad specialty, postgraduate courses shall be up to 10<sup>th</sup> May and the next specialty courses by 15<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> September. For this purpose, they shall follow the same absolute minimum in Appendix II.

- (10) There shall be no reservation of seats in respect of any academic session beyond 31<sup>st</sup> May, for postgraduate courses and 31<sup>st</sup> August for upper specialty courses under any circumstances. The University shall not regulate any reservation of seats beyond this period.

- (11) The medical institutions shall admit any candidate in any postgraduate medical course on a provisional basis, on the basis of marks obtained in the entrance examination and/or in the selection of the judgments issued by the Health Services Committee in respect of candidates. It is made that selection in postgraduate / selection of students shall be discharged by the Council for the year. The authority / institution, which grants admission to any student in postgraduate / selection of the judgments and / or in the judgments issued by the Health Services Committee, shall also be liable to have such action as may be prescribed by the Council, including suspension of the student from the course of study or any other course made from his admission under category for the succeeding academic year / years.

## 3. In the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations following clause shall be added after 59(3) :-

59C. In order to prevent and bringing to an end any unethical or unethical in Postgraduate Courses and postgraduate medical education during the course of the study of the student in accordance with the rules contained in Appendix III.

## 4. In the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2007, the following shall be added after 11.1 (a) under the heading "11.1 - Faculty" as follows shall be added after the second part :-

Eligibility shall include (1) and specialty :-



- 1. Free Chair
- 1. Professor
- 1. Associate Professor
- 1. Assistant Professor
- 1. Senior Resident
- 2. Junior Resident

Remaining seats of the department (in medical and departmental) may be occupied by Professor or Associate Professor and remaining two departments, be Assistant Professor in addition to one Senior Resident and one Junior Resident.

The above Allocation shall not apply to the Departments of Critical Care/Departments which day-wise services such as Intensive Care/Medical Oncology/Neurology/Upper GI/Hepato-biliary/Pancreatic surgery etc. The Council also intend to include the requirement of Residents in all Departments in the Postgraduate...

7. In the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2009, the following addition in clause 1.1.1(a) for the heading Staff - Faculty, the following shall be added after the third proviso:

- Maximum staff strength (Super specialty):
- Free Unit:
- 1. Professor
- 1. Associate Professor
- 1. Assistant Professor
- 1. Senior Resident
- 2. Junior Resident

Remaining seats of the department (in medical and departmental) may be occupied by Professor or Associate Professor and remaining two departments, be Assistant Professor in addition to one Senior Resident and one Junior Resident.

8. Clause 12(1) under the heading "Number of Postgraduate students to be admitted" of the "Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2009" - Following shall be substituted/added:-

The word "full-time" shall be substituted as "Resident or On-call" in 1<sup>st</sup> paragraph.

After 1<sup>st</sup> paragraph, following shall be added:-

Provided further that for a permanent Medical College/Medical Institutions, the application for admission of students on the basis of full-time shall be considered only if the College/Institution:-

- 1. Have completed 10 years.
- 2. Must have running the Postgraduate course since 10 years.
- 3. Must have completed at least 10 consecutive years of the degree programme without any gap.
- 4. Applicant must fulfil the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 for duration of years which would be granted only after physical verification of faculty, student, clinical material and infrastructural facilities.

9. Clause 13(2) under the heading "REQUISITE PERSONNEL" of the "Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2009" - In that the "each separate year" shall be substituted as follows:-  
"Academic Year or 6 months"

10. Clause 14 under the heading "EXAMINATION" of the "Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2009", Following shall be substituted as under:-

Obtaining a minimum of 40% marks in each theory paper and not less than 55% cumulatively in all the four papers for degree examination and those papers in which no examination. Obtaining of 50% marks in Practical examination shall be mandatory for passing the examination or a subject in the said degree/diploma examination in the said subject.

11. In the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2009, in appendix the following word shall be added below the Attachment schedule 1 on the institution year 2018-19 onwards for Postgraduate Courses 3 and 5 (ending):

### NOTIFICATION

#### Medical Postgraduate Entrance Examination (PGM-CET) Eligibility

Ref: Government Letter No./MsM-1005/CLB/353/10/5du-2, dated 28th September 2011.

According to the present Eligibility Criteria for Medical Postgraduate Entrance Examination (PGM-CET) conducted by the Government of Maharashtra, candidates holding MBBS Degree can appear for one or more than one time for PGM-CET Examination. Presently there is no restriction on the number of attempts for which candidate can appear to Medical Postgraduate Entrance Examination. As per the above referred letter of Government of Maharashtra (see) are new directions for the number of attempts. Rules for Eligibility to Medical Postgraduate Examination (PGM-CET-2012) will be as follows. However there is no change in the Eligibility criteria for PGM-CET-2013.

#### ~ Eligibility Criteria for PGM-CET-2013 ~

- (1) Candidates will be allowed to appear for PGM-CET only twice - first time for the examination conducted before the date of Internship completion and second time for the examination conducted after the completion of mandatory Internship period.
- (2) Being eligible and allowed for two attempts as above, if candidate does not take admission to a postgraduate course, he or she will have to complete the Bond Service before taking subsequent attempts of PGM-CET.
- (3) PGM-CET-2012 is proposed to be conducted in January/February 2013. Those who are appearing for PGM-CET-2012 as second attempt and desirous to appear for PGM-CET-2013 (which will be counted as third attempt) will have to complete one year Bond Service.
- (4) Candidates appearing for PGM-CET-2012 as third or more attempt but do not take admission to a postgraduate course will have to complete one year Bond Service before appearing for PGM-CET-2013 for subsequent attempts.
- (5) For desirous candidates there is no limit of attempts for appearing to PGM-CET Examination until mandatory one year Bond Service is completed after using two attempts.
- (6) Eligibility criteria as stated above will be applicable to all who desire to get admission to the Postgraduate Course in the State of Maharashtra through PGM-CET irrespective of whether the examination is conducted by the State Government or Central Government (Medical Council of India). However this is not applicable to those candidates who seek admission through All India Entrance Examination.
- (7) Candidates will be allowed to appear for PGM-CET only twice - first time for the examination conducted before the date of Internship completion and second time for the examination conducted after the completion of mandatory Internship period. While counting the attempts whether the candidate actually appeared for the examination or not, will not be taken into consideration.



- (8) As per the notification published on the website of Medical Council of India, Single Common Entrance Test for admission to Medical Postgraduate Courses across the country is proposed. Above rules will be applicable while filling the State Government PG seats in the State-run/Corporation-run Medical Colleges irrespective of the authority (Government of India/Governments of Maharashtra) conducting the exams.
- (9) Candidate is eligible to appear for PG-M-CEE conducted in January/February if he/she completes Internship by 31st of March of the same calendar year. While counting the two attempts for appearing to PG-M-CEE without doing a one year Bond Service two examinations will be counted-the one conducted before completion of Internship (31st March in the month of January/February in same calendar year) and the examination conducted after the date of Internship completion. (In the month of January/February in the next calendar year).
- (10) Candidate will have to complete one year Bond Service before appearing for PG-M-CEE Entrance Examination for third attempt. Candidate who does not wish to do one year Bond Service will be made eligible for third and subsequent attempts after paying Bond Penalty as per the rules.
- (11) Candidate seeking admission to postgraduate course through 50% All India Quota shall have to complete one year Bond Service after completion of Postgraduate Course.
- (12) For being eligible to appear to PG-M-CEE conducted in January/February, candidate should complete his/her Internship by 31st of March of same calendar year. If for any reasons candidate does not complete mandatory Internship by 31st March the examination conducted in January/February of same calendar year will be counted as his one attempt.
- (13) Candidate holding MBBS degree will be eligible for appearing to PG-M-CEE any number of times if he/she has completed one year Bond Service before appearing for first or second attempt.
- (14) Candidate holding MBBS degree will be eligible for appearing to PG-M-CEE any number of times if he/she has paid Bond Penalty as per the rules.
- (15) Any objections or suggestions regarding this should be communicated through Email [TeeBakdwar@gmail.com](mailto:TeeBakdwar@gmail.com) to this Directorate within 15 days from the publication of this notification. Objections or suggestions received after 15 days will not be entertained. The decision of this Directorate will be final in this regard and the same will be published on the website of the Directorate.
